



Around School

Crafty Ideas from Mrs Marshall

One of the positives of the last month in lockdown has been the evidence that arts, crafts and hobbies outside of the school curriculum have flourished - whether it is a new skill, or practising an existing talent.

In school, we have many talented children and adults who work and learn together with these 'lifestyle hobbies'. Teaching Assistant Mrs Marshall in particular, has started a knitting group with a few of the Year 6 children that she is with for lessons. Mrs Marshall has had a wonderful idea, which we are all behind. We spoke to her over the Easter holiday:

'I'm planning to decorate the school with knitted bunting! I have made a start but need some help.

I know there are some knitters in year 6 and I'm sure there are more in our families across the school.

If you would like to make some flags you can follow the pattern below. We will collect them together at school when we are able to, and crochet them together. '

To help with this project, Mrs Marshall has put together this guide. If you have any questions for her if you are starting out and would like some advice, please get in touch via office@slade.kent.sch.uk.

You will need:

Make do with whatever you have in the house, any leftover wool and any sized needles – really big or very small ones will make different sized flags.

Instructions:

Cast on 30 stiches.

Knit 3 rows.

On the next row knit the first two stitches together, knit the row until you have 2 stitches left, knit them together.

Repeat this pattern, reducing the number of stitches every fourth row, until you have 2 stitches left.

Knit 3 rows of just 2 stitches.

Knit the 2 stitches together. Cast off last stitch by cutting wool about 10 cm from your knitting and pulling it through the last loop. Pull it tight and it will make a knot. Don't cut the wool off near the flag, either use a darning needle to thread the loose end into the flag and tidy it up or leave it.

Tips

Don't worry if you lose count of the rows. Your triangle will be a slightly different shape.

Don't worry if you end up with 3 stitches at the end instead of 2. Knit 2 of them together knit the next stitch and carry on as above.

YouTube has lots of knitting guides for help with casting on.


A- Pineapples




Do you want to make 3D fruits of your choice with paper? If so then read this fun 'recipe' to do so with your very own: Pineapple, Apple, Orange or cherry 3D fruits on paper. I have made examples to look at!

What you will need

- 0
- Coloured card (Yellow, Red, Orange, Green and pink for all of the fruits)
 - Felt tips (Brown and green)
 - First you choose a colour for the base I have chosen green
 - 2. Find the colour for the fruit you want I am making a Pineapple, and an orange so I chose yellow and orange
 - 3. Ask an adult to cut two circles if you are making an Apple, Orange, or 4 for cherry's. If you are making a Pineapple cut out 2 ovals with flat bottoms. Make sure the two are the same size
 - 4. Fold the circle/oval in half
 - 5. Glue half onto paper and the other fold the other half upwards
 - 6. Finally draw details like stalks/leaves
