You will also have access to a Slade App, an easy one touch button to all of this information - no more looking in different mailboxes or navigating around different sites.

# Help From Across the County

Everyone at Slade Primary School and Kent County Council are acutely aware of the effect the COVID-19 outbreak and subsequent lockdown measures are having on the mental health of both children and adults.

For people of all ages needing immediate mental health support, just text the word "Kent" or "Medway" to 85258. This is a new 24/7 text service provided by SHOUT and the Crisis Text Line as part of the Kent and Medway Release the Pressure campaign.

Other services that young people can access directly are:

**Kooth** is a mental health and wellbeing online platform for young people aged 10 to 16 across the whole of Kent. The service is free and can be accessed at **www.kooth.com**. It's a place to get advice, information and support 24/7.

We would like to reassure every child in Year 6 and their families that everyone at Slade and the staff responsible for a happy and smooth transition in to your different secondary schools haven't forgotten what an important job this is.

You may of already heard from your new school, saying that their transition events and visits to Slade have been, or maybe cancelled. This hasn't stopped each of them contacting Mr Osborne, Miss Lidlow and Mrs Barber for detailed information on each of you in order to make the journey to Year 7 as enjoyable and worry-free as possible for each individual - for whenever that journey begins.

The different secondary schools also have your wellbeing at heart and some even plan to contact you directly for a chat. Contact their admissions teams for more information if you have any questions about how they plan to proceed with the Year 7 transitions. Please be mindful that situations may change as government advice is taken on board by each individual school.

We are equally aware of the different events that you are missing this term (although this week was meant to be SATs week so you may not be so sad about that!) One of which was due to be Safety in Action, run by Project Salus. Salus have been in touch with us this week to confirm that you won't miss out on this vital and extremely fun workshop day, as they will run the event at a time within Year 7.

# Has Your Situation Changed?

We appreciate that the changing environment through the COVID crisis and before, may mean that some of our families now qualify for extra support through the Free School Meals scheme.

If you are in receipt of any of the following, you will qualify:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)






# ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY


