

#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

Friday: Margareta Pizza, Sweetcorn, Chips, Flapjack or Fruit Pots


The two week rota and list of allergens will be sent to children in Year R, 1, 6 and the Critical Worker bubble next week.

#### For Our Titans

The NHS National Deaf Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service have produced a booklet with lots of resources for dealing with Covid-19.

### **Kent Test Registrations**

Parents and carers of children who are in Year 5 who are wishing to take the Kent Test (often known as the 11+) in preparation for making their secondary school choices will want to know that the registration window is now open.


The Kent Test is administered by Kent County Council with the aim being to determine if a pupil is deemed by the council as being a suitable candidate for secondary education at a Grammar School in the county.

You do not have to take the Kent Test if you are not interested in pursuing the possibility of admission to a Grammar School for the start of KS3 in September 2021.

If you would like to register your child for the Kent Test, normally held in the first week of Term 1 in Year 6, please visit <a href="https://www.kent.gov.uk/education-and-children/schools/school-places/kent-test#tab-1">https://www.kent.gov.uk/education-and-children/schools/school-places/kent-test#tab-1</a>. You should keep an eye on that page for updates on when and where the test will be administered as this is being discussed presently due to the continued COVID-19 suspension of normal schooling for your children.

Registrations for the 2020 Kent Test must be made by the closing date of Midnight, Wednesday 1 July.




### **Meet The Byrnes Family and More**

Urgent messages can also be sent via SMS. Please make sure we have an up-to-date mobile telephone number. We use Teachers to Parents SMS.



### Slade learners in School










This week we have welcomed back small groups of children in Year R and Year 1 to, remotely, join those children who have been in our Key and Critical Worker Bubble throughout lockdown.

We hope that the children who have been back to school for the first time in 10 weeks have enjoyed themselves - the staff at school have very much enjoyed having you back with us!




### **And at Home!**
