

Dear Parents and Carers,

This week saw us once again increase in number as we welcomed back our Year 6 pupils into school! Just like their younger counterparts the Year 6 children all came smiling through the gate and quickly readjusted to the new rules and routines that have been introduced since they were last here. It has been lovely to spend time with each of them in their lunchtime bubbles and catch up on all the news since they were last here! So yesterday, with all bubbles in, we had 87 children in school which is our highest attendance since March!

As I mention above, new rules and routines have been introduced across the school to reflect the protective measures that have been put in place with the aim of keeping everyone safe during their time in the building. We have therefore made some changes to our school behaviour policy to reflect the new routines and to outline the reward and sanction systems now in place. A copy of these changes can be found in our Behaviour Policy Addendum located in the policy section on the school website.

You will all no doubt be aware of the government's recent announcement stating a change of plan regarding all children returning to school before the summer break. I am yet to receive any additional guidance or direction from the Department for Education (DfE) to that which was shared by Gavin Williamson earlier this week. However, please be assured that the school leadership team continue to plan for the further reintegration of more pupils back into school, whether this be in the short term or long term. We will of course, as always, share this plan with you once we are in a position to do so following receipt of further DfE guidance.

Thank you to those parents who have got in touch requesting resources to support their children in understanding recent events following the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis last month. We have compiled a list of resources to support any parent who may wish to use them with their child which are available on the school portal. May I take this opportunity to remind everyone that Slade Primary School embraces diversity, celebrating and respecting the differences between all in our community; any prejudice, including that which is racially motivated, will not be tolerated and will be dealt with in line with school policy. The school's current Equality Scheme is in the process of being reviewed and we would welcome input from members of our school community; if this is something that you would be interested in being involved in then please contact me via the school office.

Today we held our first virtual Celebration Assembly where we were joined not just by the children in their bubbles in school but also by many of our Year 6s from their homes! It was lovely to gather together to celebrate the achievements of the children with their learning, whether that had been here in school or from home via the portal. Therefore, we will be extending the invite next Friday to all those that wish to join us at 2pm, technology permitting; Zoom invites will be sent to you all later this week. In the meantime do check out a recording of today's assembly on the school portal.




If you have more than one child at Slade that has instrumental lessons then please complete a separate survey for each child.

Notice of Works from SGN

Nicole McNab of gas network company SGN has written to us with the following information about works they are carrying out over the next 4 months which may affect you as you travel in and out of Tonbridge



She says:

We know that during the coronavirus outbreak, our communities will rely on us now more than ever to keep them safe and warm. The safety of our communities and our employees will remain our number one priority in the weeks and months ahead.

We need to carry out safety-critical work to upgrade the gas network in the area of Tonbridge near to Slade Primary School. This work needs to go ahead now, rather than wait until the pandemic passes, to ensure the local community continues to receive a safe and reliable gas supply. Our contractor, Medway Civils & Utilities will complete this work on our behalf.

We will start setting up our site on 14 June 2020 in High Street Tonbridge, with a northbound traffic restriction coming into effect on the 15 June 2020.

In close consultation with Kent County Council, we have agreed to complete the following work, which includes traffic management in place to ensure the safety of everyone around the site:

- On **15 June 2020, for approximately 14 weeks, we will be working in the High Street** from the junction with Portman Park to outside The Ivy House
- We will need to implement a northbound traffic restriction for vehicles travelling away from the centre of town on the High Street, between our works. Please note, southbound traffic heading towards the town centre will remain unrestricted
- A signed diversion will be in place via: Bordyke, Hadlow Road and Yardley Park Road
- HGVs will need to follow an alternative signed route via: the A26, the Tonbridge Bypass (A21) and London Road (B245)
- Please note, the work around Portman Park will require us to go onto London Road (B245). Although there will be some carriageway incursion, traffic management will not be necessary
- We will also be working on Bordyke, from outside number 7 to the junction with the High Street, with no traffic restrictions expected

Pedestrian access, including social distancing measures, will be maintained throughout

We are working closely with UK Government and public health bodies to make sure we work safely and in line with expert advice during the COVID-19 outbreak. We have extra safety precautions in place to protect our colleagues and our customers from catching or spreading the virus as we carry out our safety-critical project.

We may need to enter properties to upgrade gas supplies as part of this work, although this will be towards the end of our project. This will depend on where the gas pipe and meter are located. We may also need to temporarily interrupt gas supplies to individual properties and will provide five working days' notice beforehand.

Urgent messages can also be sent via SMS. Please make sure we have an up-to-date mobile telephone number. We use Teachers to Parents SMS.


