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## Mrs Slade

#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

Happy Friday everyone! I hope that you have all had an enjoyable week.

We've enjoyed having up to 97 children in school this week as we welcomed back more children into Reception, Years 1 and 6 and additional children into our critical worker bubble too. It's been lovely to see more of you in school; we hope that you've all enjoyed being back as much as we've all enjoyed seeing you all!

As you are aware, school opened more widely on 1 June 2020 to children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 in line with all government directives and guidance. You may also be aware that the original government plan for all children in other year groups to return to school before the end of the academic year has now changed. The latest DfE guidance states:

"There is no expectation on primary schools to welcome back additional children where they do not have capacity to do so. Where schools have capacity, they may choose to welcome back additional pupils. It is up to schools to decide which pupils to prioritise, based on their knowledge of their children and communities."

Therefore, I have written to parents of children in Years 2 and 5 today outlining the plan for a safe return to school for children in those year groups. This will be for one day a week for the remainder of the term. The leadership team are currently in the process of assessing our capacity to also welcome back children in Years 3 and 4 before the end of term and I will be writing to parents of children in these year groups next week with further information.

At the time of writing we are still awaiting guidance from the government regarding the wider opening of schools and the impact that this will have for the start of the new academic year. The leadership team are planning ahead for various scenarios in anticipation of what the guidance might suggest; we will of course share our plans with you once we are in a position to do so. However, regardless of what the return to school may look like in September it remains of paramount importance that all children are as prepared as possible for this transition into their new class. Therefore I have written to all parents today to inform you of the class and staffing arrangements for the next academic year. Thank you in anticipation for sharing this information with your children.

Yesterday I wrote to all parents to inform them of the arrangements that we have put in place for end of year parent consultation meetings with your child's current class teacher. A reminder please that appointments can be made by directly contacting your child's class teacher from the start of next week. Thank you.

Apologies that we were unable to widen our invite this week to our virtual celebration assembly as hoped due to some technical difficulties; fingers crossed for next week! Once again do check out a recording of today's assembly on the school portal. For those that haven't already seen it then please do also take a look at yesterday's assembly led by the Duchess of Cambridge during which she spoke about the importance of mental wellbeing among children. 

## Rashford Scores for Children Everywhere

You won't have failed to notice that Free School Meals have been in the headlines for most of the week.

Thanks to the efforts of footballer Marcus Rashford (pictured) the benefits for

families who qualify for Free School Meals and Pupil Premium funding in school will continue over the summer holidays. The football star, who in lockdown has also helped raise £20 million with food poverty charity Fare Share to enable meals to be delivered to vulnerable people, and in direct relation to our work at Slade, just before lockdown in March, was busy learning Sign Language to be able to judge a poetry competition run by the BBC for World Book Day; see the video here https://www.bbc.co.uk/sport/av/football/51747432.

We will continue to issue the supermarket vouchers via email to the recipients who have been confirmed to date. It is not too late to apply if you believe you may be entitled through your receipt of selected state benefits. Remember that Free School Meals entitlement is not the same as the universal school meals provided to KS1 and EYFS children automatically. You should still apply if appropriate, even if your child is in Year R, 1 or 2. This benefit is particularly relevant now as many people's personal financial situations may have been adversely affected by the lockdown.

## **Meetings Moved**


