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# Mrs Slade

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you all remain safe and well and have managed to keep cool these last few days.

Children in school this week have been making the most of our fabulous school grounds as they themselves sought to keep cool during the week too. They have enjoyed taking their learning outside whether that be looking at the science of the plants, den building in the woods or simply reading a story in the shade of the trees. Meanwhile, Reception children have enjoyed harvesting the potatoes that were planted back in March then cooking and feasting on them together in class! Do check out the photographs of the potato journey on our Twitter feed!

It was lovely to see so many of you at our celebration assemblies this afternoon; well done to each and every one of the children who got recognised for their achievements this week, whether that be for their work here in school or at home on the portal. Certificates and stickers will be with you shortly!

Following on from my update last week regarding the plan for pupils in Years 2 and 5 to return to school I wrote to parents of children in Years 3 and 4 yesterday outlining the plan for a safe return to school for children in those year groups too. This will be for two consecutive days at the end of term. Thank you to those parents who have already responded to our survey indicating whether or not you wish your child to return; your early response is much appreciated. A reminder that the deadline for responding is Tuesday 30 June.

I am delighted that all children now have an option to return to school before the end of term and have been given an opportunity to have closure on what has been a most extraordinary school year, whilst also having chance to begin to prepare for the year ahead. In order to provide this opportunity for all pupils to return, school will now be closing for the start of the summer break on **Friday 17 July** to children in Years R, 1, 2, 5, and 6 in addition to those children of critical workers too. In doing so we are then able to welcome back children in Years 3 and 4 on **Tuesday 21** and **Wednesday 22 July**. Thank you in anticipation for your understanding with this decision and the reasoning that underpins it.

Therefore, school will be closing to all pupils for the summer holidays at the end of the day on **Wednesday 22 July**. We recognise the need for everyone in our school community to have a break during this time and therefore will be closed to all pupils for most, if not all, of the holiday period. I will be writing to you next week to confirm these details and dates whilst also signposting you to local holiday clubs and child care activities planned for the summer holidays.

At the time of writing we are once again awaiting further guidance from the government regarding the wider opening of schools and the impact that this will have for the start of the new academic year. As I shared last week, the leadership team have planned ahead for various scenarios in anticipation of what the guidance might suggest; we will of course share our plans with you once we are in a position to do so.

I hope that you all have a lovely weekend.

### **Year 6 Children**

If you currently have a debt on your Nourish ParentPay account, please make sure this is paid in full before Friday 3 July to prevent a debt procedure being carried out.

If you have credit on your account and don't plan to use the school meal service again before the end of Term 6 you have two options:

1. Use the credit to pay for a siblings meals once school reopens
2. Request a refund.

### **Year 2 Children**

Nourish will shortly be in touch with you to invite you to set up a ParentPay account with them in order to pay for your child's school dinners in Year 3. ParentPay is the payment partner of Nourish and is not contracted by the school. KS2 children are not included in the Governments Universal Free School Meals scheme which have paid for school dinners to date. The current cost of a meal per day is £2.20 which includes the full range of choice that the children have got used to. When you receive your joining letter, please login and keep the account topped-up in advance. You do not have to choose dinners, the children will continue to do this at the kitchen counter.



## Welcome to Slade

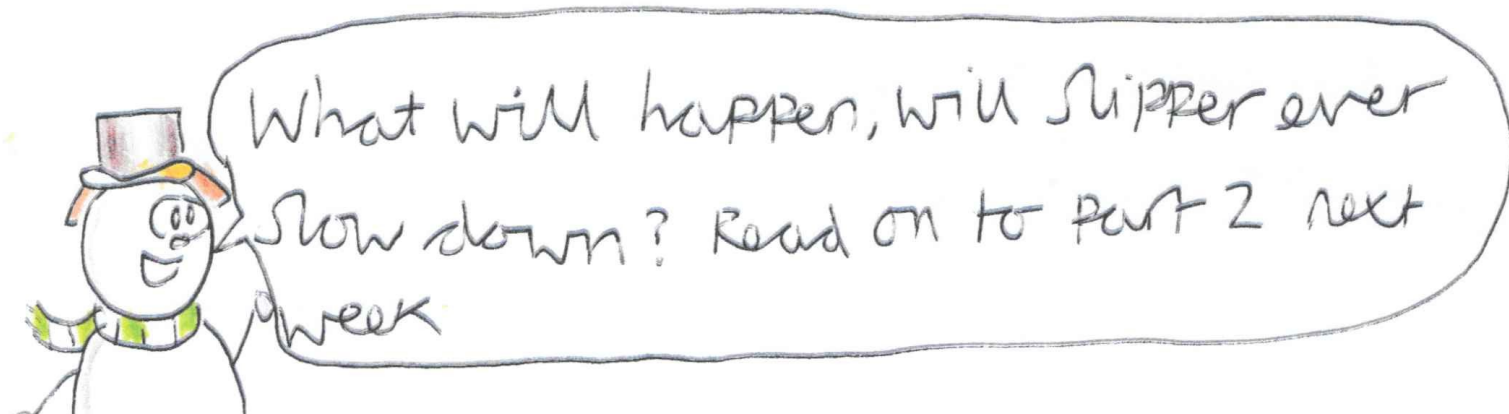

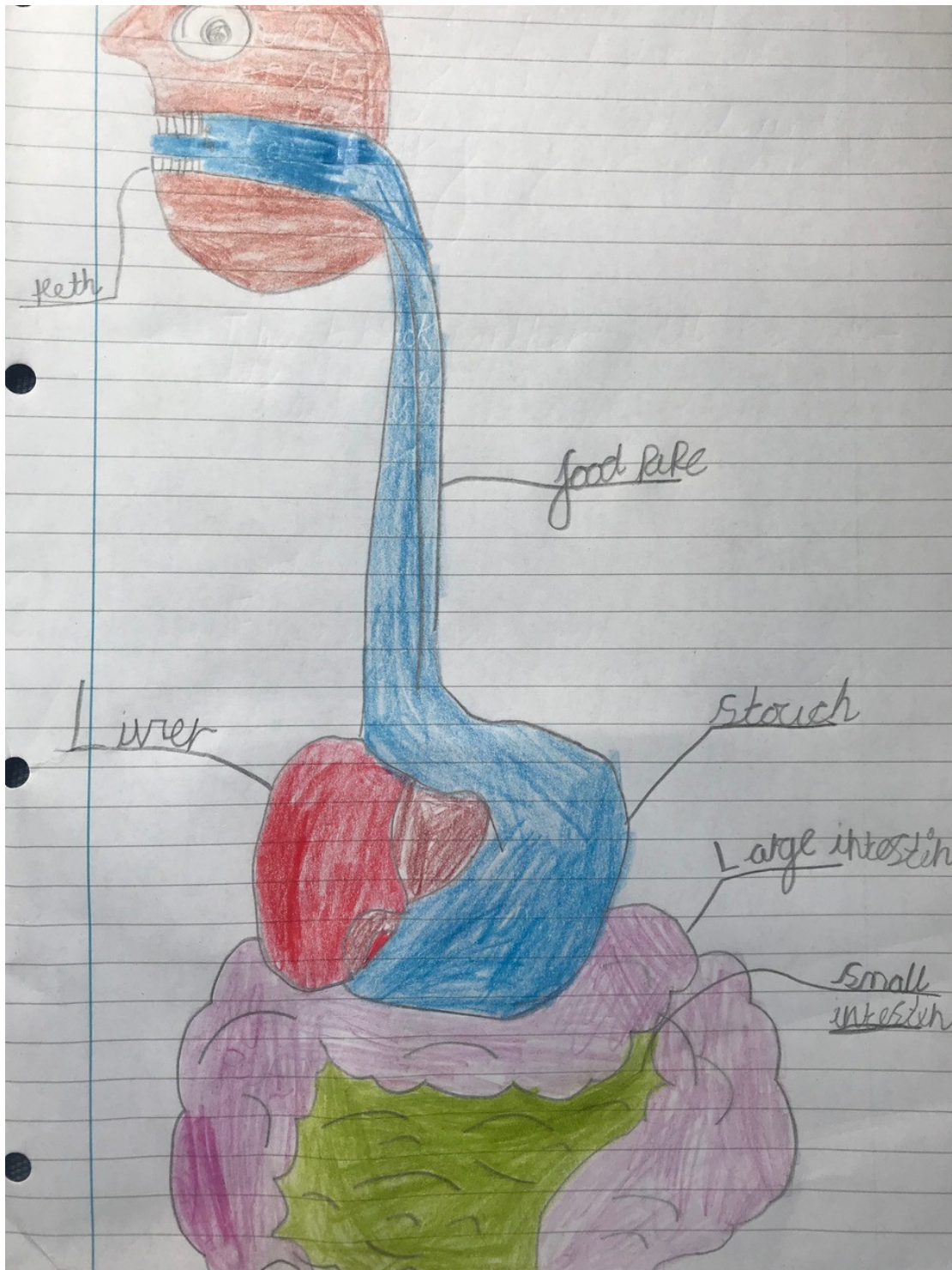

Our dip into your home learning this week sees us visit Peter and his family from Pegasus Class in Year 3.

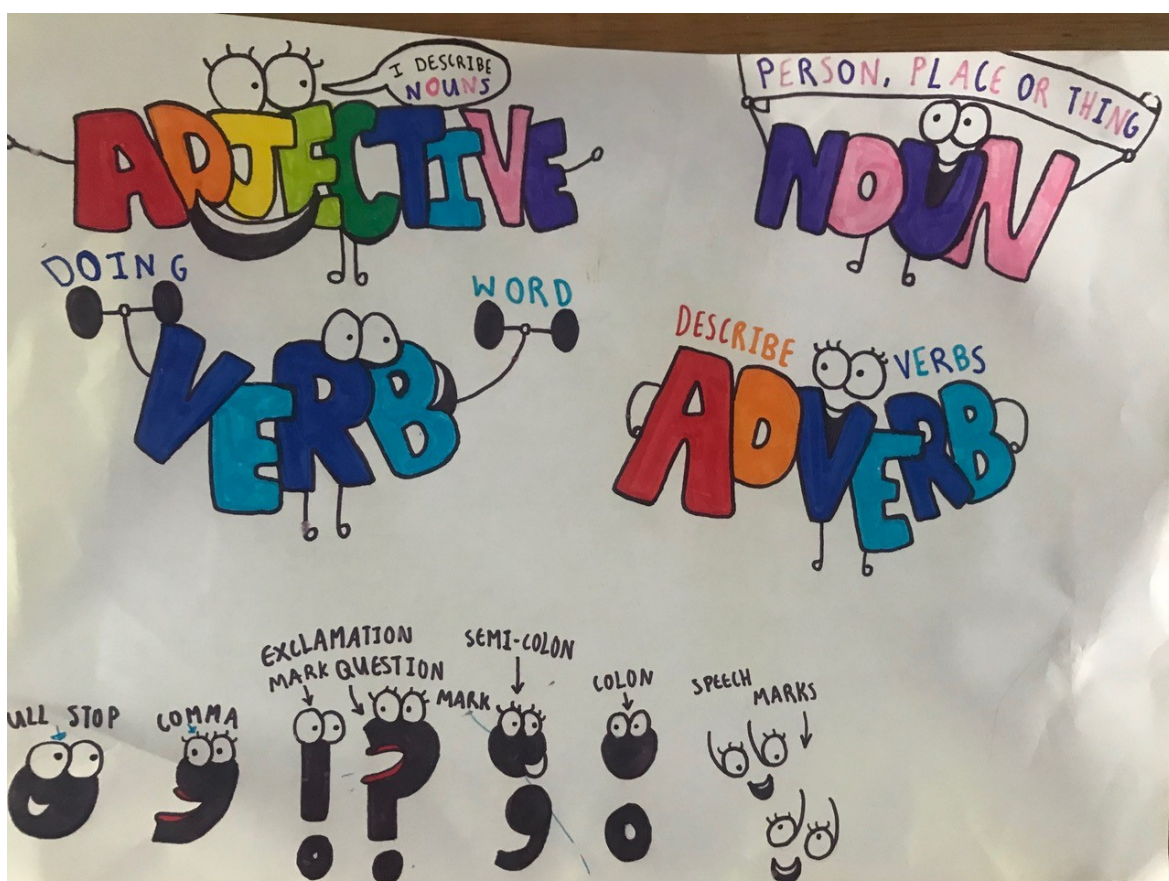
