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
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Slade Primary School Newsletter 2020/21 Term 1 Issue 3/ Friday 23 October 2020









Dear Parents and Carers,

I want to start this last newsletter of Term 1 by saying a huge thank you to everyone for your help and support in keeping school a safe and healthy place during this first term. Your co-operation, understanding and adjustments to the new routines and rules have ensured that it's been business as usual throughout the term with all children now back in school enjoying their learning. I hope that everyone gets to enjoy a well-deserved rest and break from school during the coming week.

We are aware that some families may need to contact the school during half term to notify us of any changes in your circumstances related to Covid-19. Please notify us of these changes using the new email address c19@slade.kent.sch.uk This email account will be monitored daily and is only for notification of suspected Covid cases. If your child or a family member displays any of the key symptoms then please call NHS 111 in the first instance for guidance.

We continue to review and assess the protective measures that we have in place to ensure the ongoing safety of our school community, including at drop off and pick up times. I would encourage you all to revisit the information that was sent out at the start of term regarding arrangements for these times of the day, including the importance of social distancing at the school gate. All information previously shared can be accessed via your Arbor account. In addition, we have also been in contact with the local police and Road Safety Officer regarding the irresponsible driving and parking that is continuing to be witnessed on a daily basis, particularly at the junction of Hawden Road. Any continuation of this behaviour will now be reported directly by the school to the police. If you need to drive your child to school then please use the local car parks at drop off and pick up times; thank you.

Continuing on the theme of road safety, a special mention for those pupils in Year 6 who this week have been spending their days outside completing their Bikeability training, particularly to those children who spent the day out in the pouring rain on Wednesday! Bikeability is a cycling course that teaches children the practical skills of cycling whilst providing an understanding of how to cycle on today's roads. This year the course has been modified to ensure all safety measures are in place with the children learning in much smaller groups than in previous years. We look forward to the remainder of year 6 completing their training next term.

A reminder that there will be no before and after school provision in place for week beginning 2 November. Details for the remainder of Term 2 will now be shared during the first week of term following further discussion by the school governors after the half term break.

Many thanks to those parents, carers, governors and staff who attended the inaugural Zoom PTA Meeting last night! It was lovely to see so many of you there on screen showing your support and sharing your ideas of how you can continue to fundraise during these challenging times. We look forward to hearing more about the plans that you now have for the coming term. Thank you!

I hope that you all have a restful half term break next week and look forward to seeing you back in school at the start of Term 2 on Monday 2nd November.

Edward (Sphinx) "It feels a bit different."


Archie (Griffin) "It's better than being at home, seeing all my friends is good, I have loved doing a non chronological report in English."

Book of the Week / The Boy at the Back of the Class


This is a story about an ordinary nine-year-old child, Ahmet and his three classmates. Ahmet has come to their school as a refugee (he is the boy at the back of the class). When the children in his class find out he is separated from his family, they come up with a plan to help. The classmates have a great impact on Ahmet's life through their kindness and curiosity. It is an inspiring read that helps children think about what it is to be a good person. Told with heart and humour it highlights the importance of friendship and kindness in a world that doesn't always make sense.

Tonbridge Library

Our library at Slade is bursting back into life, and all children are having the opportunity to borrow books once again, which is fantastic. We'd also like to remind you that Tonbridge library is offering a socially distanced book browsing service for customers so they can select books from the shelves.
