


Reading Room Project

We will keep you posted via the newsletter and twitter on how the project is progressing.






Around School

As you know, reading is the lifeblood to all of our learning and we are keen as ever this year to see all of our children enjoying their reading - whether it be reading their school book out loud to their family at home, or with their nose in a comic or magazine, book from the library or looking at information from their latest topic. Book of the Week/Wonder

An extremely moving tale of August Pullman., a boy born with a facial deformity. It tells the story of his school and home life and how he faces the challenges it brings. This is such a powerful and funny read that explores how people react with each other and how adults and children behave differently. It is also told from different characters' perspectives. Wonder is an engaging and thought provoking read, one to pass on to others and remember long after the final page.

Reading and autism in young children

Making reading a fun activity can help an autistic child with learning and social skills. Sharing books is a great way to connect and can help with language development and listening. Here are a few tips to help when reading with young children:

- Sit on the floor together
- Read for only short periods of time to start with, pointing and naming objects as you read
- Look at books that have photos of babies and people's faces. This can help recognise emotions
 - Read the same story repetitively and find books that have repetition and rhymes
 - Talk about pictures while reading the text
 - Share books on topics that interest your child
 - Find books that have buttons to press to make sounds
