Instead, parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace. Any contact with families regarding the need to self-isolate will be made via email.

Finally, a huge thank you to all of our PTA who have been working tirelessly across the term with their fundraising efforts which culminated last week in the Christmas raffle prize draw; huge thanks to all involved in making this happen. Term 3 Topics

The teaching teams across the school are already looking forward to new learning in Term 3. We are pleased to share with you, details of next term's topics. Your child may want to find out some information to help their learning, or to share with their friends in January.



EYFS Year R: The Gingerbread Man

We will be learning the story of The Gingerbread Man, acting it out, retelling it and, of course, making biscuits., hopefully ours won't run away! After this, we will be invaded by Aliens in Underpants!

Year 1: Terrific Toys

We compare toys from the 1960s to modern day toys, thinking about the passing of time and how toys have changed over the years. In DT, the children will be designing and making their own toys and learning about mechanisms such as axles and wheels.





Year 2: Keeping Busy

We will continue using Talk for Writing to create stories and information pages. In Maths, the children will recap addition and subtraction and move onto multiplication and division. Science will focus on Living Things whilst Art will be inspired by many artists-past and present. Within Computing, they will become photographers as well as coders!!! Lots to keep busy!

Year 3: The Romans

We will be learning about the Roman Empire, Boudicca, Hadrian's Wall (right) and gladiatorial games amongst other things! The term will culminate in a Roman Day (details to follow in January!) We will also be learning about Forces in Science, the children will be making their own roman purses in DT complete with coins and, in English, we will be learning how to write exciting myths.



Year 4: The Sunshine State

We will be learning about The Sunshine State next term, looking at Florida in lots of detail, specifically; The Kennedy Space Centre, how people in Florida cope with hurricanes and The Magic Kingdom (Disneyland). English sees learning about instruction writing and classic poetry. In science, we move on from animals including humans to look at states of matter.



Year 5: Our National Parks

In Year 5, we will be looking at British National Parks – where are they, what are they and who are they for?

Year 6: How is Climate Change affecting the World?



Our investigation focuses initially on the personal stories of real people around the world who are being impacted upon by changes in the usual weather patterns. The scale of study is local, whether the location is in The Gambia, Australia, the United Kingdom or Greenland (left) as children's circumstances are similar wherever they are. The pupils will be encouraged to see these apparently unconnected examples in the broader context of the concept of global warming on a global scale. They investigate the


main manifestations of global warming and also spend time understanding its causes, particularly in relation to greenhouse gas emissions from the increased burning of fossil fuels.
