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

From 1-7 February 2021, we're taking part in Place2Be's Children's Mental Health Week. Place2Be is the UK's leading school-based children's mental health charity: 'Our mission is to improve children's mental health, and we believe that no child should have to face mental health problems alone.'



This year's theme is 'Express Yourself' and we're encouraging children (and adults) to explore the different ways we can express ourselves and the creative ways that we can share our feelings, our thoughts and our ideas. With schools partially closed and lots of uncertainty, children and young people's mental health has never been more important.

Place2Be has created some activities and an assembly and Mrs Knee has been busy sourcing further resources for the week. These will be set via Teams as usual every day next week.

Additionally, we are encouraging everyone, whether in school or at home to 'Dress to Express' on Friday 5th February. The idea is simple: use colour to express yourself by wearing a colourful outfit. Our lives are full of colour and we can use colour to help make sense of how we're feeling, who we are and the world we live in. You could wear your favourite colour or choose a range of colours that express how you're feeling. 

Reading Bingo

Reading Bingo has taken off all over Tonbridge!

Congratulations to the children who have managed to complete a line or four corners of their Key Stage Card that we featured a couple of weeks ago. Tim (Hippogriff Class), Ted (Wyvern) and Annabelle in Sprite Class have all shared their stories of success with us:



Tim has completed ten of the categories on his card when we caught up with him: 'My favourite book that I read during this challenge was Harry Potter and the Cabinet of Fire: J.K. Rowling is one of my favourite authors, along with David Walliams. I have read more than one book written by J.K. Rowling and by David Walliams including Code Name Bananas in my picture.

My favourite category to complete was listening to an audio book in bed. I listened to the first Harry Potter book on audio and to Bad dad by David Walliams more than once after reading the book itself.'

Tim plays close attention when he listens to audio books, evidenced when he continues, 'Stephen Fry was the narrator for the Harry Potter books, but mostly I liked listening to David Walliams read out his own book, Bad Dad.'

Ted is a keen and successful sportsman, so he used skills picked up on the football field to think strategically. This helped him to the satisfaction of completing a line of the card quickly.

Making breakfast one day recently, Ted decided to find out how the cooker worked, so he read through the relevant sections in the manual - this was written before his birth (tick!) Although he found it boring - and who are we to argue that home appliance instruction books were written to be thrillers! Much more to Ted's taste however were the instructions to Airfix models that he has taken up making. Reading these instructions, then transferring the knowledge learnt into correctly making the model requires lots of concentration and accurate reading - well done Ted.

When he wants to relax, Ted has been indulging in his love of sport, listening to podcasts, especially those presented by Peter Crouch and carp fisherman, Ali Hamidi. (both, right)



Finally today, well done to Annabelle in Year2, our first Key Stage 1 winner.

In completing her line on the bingo card, Annabelle has been reading all over the place! She loves reading to her dog, Milo at home as well to her toy, 'baby'

Like many families in lockdown, Annabelle has been catching up with her family on video calls: she read to her Nanny on a call recently treating her to Peppa Pig goes Swimming - one of Annabelle's favourite books.

What Makes You Special?



In their PSHE (Personal Social and Health Education) lesson last week, Year 1 were asked to think about what makes them special and their task was to think about the following:
