From the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

- Face coverings should be worn at drop off and pick up times by all adults unless you are exempt from doing so
- When waiting in line at the school gates please keep into the side to ensure that the pavements remain as clear as possible
- Only 1 adult per family to be dropping off and picking up to help to limit congestion where space is limited
- When using the pavements please keep to the left wherever possible

Many thanks to those who drive to school for using the Lower Castle Fields car park and walking your child to the school gate. However, a small minority of parents continue to endanger the lives of many with their insistence on driving their child to the school gate, particularly at the Hawden Road entrance, with no due care or consideration for others. Therefore, I will now be writing separately to parents who continue to do this and informing the local [Civil Enforcement Officers](#). Thank you too to those parents who have individually contacted the local councilors and raised your concerns about this issue with them; your support is very much appreciated.

I hope that you all enjoy a restful, relaxing weekend and I look forward to welcoming you back into school next week.

Please Drive and Park Responsibly

We have been made aware of and are concerned by some irresponsible driving and, in some cases illegal, parking since the return to school. This has resulted in complaints from our neighbours and situations that have been dangerous for our children and their families.

Please remember that the only safe and responsible place to park is in the Swimming Pool Car Park (Lower Castle Fields). We are very lucky to have the support of Tonbridge and Malling Council, who continue to offer free parking at drop off (valid 08:25 to 09:10) and collection time (valid 14:45 to 15:30) in this parking facility, just 200m from the main playground entrance to the school and even closer to the School Office entrance and Deacon House Gates.

Tonbridge and Malling Council and Kent Police would like to remind all parents, carers and visitors to Slade that:



There should be NO PARKING anywhere in Castlefields. This includes the mouth of this road opposite the School Office entrance to school. The rest of Castlefields is a Private Road.



There should be NO PARKING in parking spaces attached to the new apartments adjacent to Castlefields. These are private parking bays for owners of the apartments.



It is advised to perform NO U-TURNS along Stafford Road during drop-off and collection times. This practise has led to near miss road traffic accidents this week.




If you have any library books at home from before Lockdown, please return them as soon as you can so they can be quarantined and put back for loaning.

Registers are taken 10 minutes after the school gates close for your child's yeargroup.



- **If the test comes back with a positive result, inform school immediately so we can invoke suitable measures. This can be via email if out of office hours, during the weekend or in the holidays: C19@slade.kent.sch.uk**

Any individual or group sent a 10 day self isolation notification should continue their home learning via the familiar Microsoft Teams page, accessible through the school website and Teams App.

Please contact the class teacher via the class email address if you have any questions about this home learning.



COVID-19 restrictions are still in place across Tonbridge, the rest of Kent and across the whole of England.



Please make sure you are aware of the current regulations and laws to keep yourself and your family safe as well as respecting our request to maintain a 2 metre distance between yourself and other families when walking to and from school as well as wearing a face covering when waiting at the school gates.
