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

Dear Parents and Carers,

Well done and thank you everyone for another successfully busy week here in school!

I am delighted to welcome Maxine Button to the staff team, joining us in her role of Family Liaison Officer (FLO). Maxine is an experienced FLO who will be working alongside Christina Ekperigin, creating a full time FLO position here in school and ensuring that a FLO is now onsite every day across the week. As you are aware, Viki Garrett and I have been working since November in a supportive role at Wateringbury CE Primary School. This week pupils, staff and parents at the school were informed of the successful appointment of Miss Deborah Johnson to the post of substantive Headteacher with effect from September 2021. Therefore, Viki and I will be continuing in our roles working with the school for the remainder of this academic year. We are both looking forward to liaising with Debbie in the coming months in preparation for September and wish her and the school every success moving forward.

Earlier this week I was invited to attend the Slade Area Resident Association Meeting to discuss the impact of school traffic on the local residents at drop off and pick up times. There was lots of positive discussion of how we can work together to minimise disruption and ensure the safety of the whole community during these busy times. This included local residents now reporting any concerns that they have to the local council and the local PCSO. I assured those present that as a school we will strive to park and drive with due care and consideration at all times; thank you for your ongoing support with this matter.

Thank you too to those parents who responded to our recent survey regarding wraparound provision here at Slade. With existing COVID-19 restrictions in place we are currently unable to provide care for children outside of the school day in the way that we did prior to lockdown. Therefore, we are in the process of exploring other options that will enable us to safely provide childcare for those families that meet the criteria for a place, as outlined in the DfE out-of-school-setting guidance, without it impacting on the safety of the remainder of the school community. Therefore, there will be no wraparound provision at the start of Term 5. An update will be provided to parents by the end of Week 2 regarding plans for the remainder of the year. Once again, please be assured that this decision has not been taken lightly and has been made with the safety of the whole school community at the centre. We are sorry for the inconvenience that this continues to cause for some of our families but thank you again for your ongoing understanding of this decision.

Finally, congratulations this week to Viki Garrett who has successfully passed her National Professional Qualification for Headship (NPQH), a professional qualification that supports the development of aspiring headteachers. Well done Viki!

I hope that you all enjoy a restful, relaxing weekend and I look forward to seeing you on Monday for the final week of Term 4.

Term Dates 2021/22

We are pleased to say that the term dates for the next school year are now available on our website.



The first day back at school for the then Year 1 to Year 6 will be Monday 6 September.

The first day of the school year is, as every year, 1 September; however, to extend the summer by another week for our families, we have allocated the first three days as internal staff training (INSET) days. Every school will allocate 5 days of staff training. Our remaining two INSET days will be communicated as soon as they are decided.

The dates on the website are correct at the time you view them and will be amended immediately if any alterations are made. Alterations could be, but are not limited to any COVID-19 related closures or statutory changes (handed down by central government).

Each school year consists of 190 school days or 380 sessions (morning and afternoon sessions). We continue our commitment to encourage attendance at each of these sessions in order for each child to fully reach their academic and social potential. Please arrange family holidays (once it is safe to do so) to fall within the school holidays published and routine medical appointments outside of school hours where you can - we understand that this is not always possible.


Oak Academy Literacy Trust Author of the Week

The Literacy Trust Oak Academy Online Library Author of the Week is Venessa Taylor.

Venessa spent over twenty years working in her home city of London as teacher and Assistant Headteacher, and counts amongst her career highlights as successfully seeing reluctant readers, particularly the boys, engaging in reading for pleasure.





Venessa uses that experience and her love of seeing everyone enjoying reading via her book Baller Boys, aimed at encouraging young boys to find pleasure in reading; the football themed stories are written with young readers in mind.

You can read Baller Boys for free, by clicking below - it really is an excellent book as you get to meet football crazy best friends Shay and Frankie. They eat, sleep and breathe football, love a kick-about in the park and watch all the big games on TV...all that's missing is the chance to play for a real football team. COVID-19

If your child shows symptoms of COVID-19 you should:





- Stay at home, do not attend any other place out of the household. This applies to everyone in the household. Telephone 111 if you require advice
- Get a COVID-19 test for the symptomatic person, via the gov.uk website
- If the test comes back with a positive result, inform school immediately so we can invoke suitable measures. This can be via email if out of office hours, during the weekend or in the holidays: C19@slade.kent.sch.uk

Any individual or group sent a 10 day self isolation notification should continue their home learning via the familiar Microsoft Teams page, accessible though the school website and Teams App.

Please contact the class teacher via the class email address if you have any questions about this home learning.
