


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Slade Primary School Newsletter 2020/21 Term 5 Issue 4 / Friday 14 May 2021





Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has seen all of the children in school contribute to a collective piece of artwork to be displayed in the entrance hall in the main building. Each of them has drawn their self-portrait using shades of just one colour with each portrait going to be assembled together to create our very own Slade rainbow! This came about following one of our recent whole school assemblies where we explored the theme of being individually different but, just like the colours of the rainbow, beautiful together too! I will share a photo of the finished display once it is complete but there is a sneak preview of what to expect below!

As previously shared, we will be holding Parent Consultation meetings during Week 1 of Term 6, on 8 and 10 June. As in Term 1 these meetings will be held virtually and will be an opportunity for you to meet with your child's class teacher to discuss how your child has settled back into school post lockdown in addition to outlining the next steps for your child with their learning. Meetings will be held on Microsoft teams and can be booked on Arbor as of 5pm on Friday 21 May. Further details regarding booking arrangements and how to access Microsoft Teams will be sent out in a separate letter.

As you are aware, on Monday 10 May the Prime Minister announced that the country will move to Step 3 of the roadmap from Monday 17 May. As a result of this announcement the Department for Education (DfE) has made some minor changes to their guidance for schools. However, the changes made are primarily applicable to secondary schools and the wearing of face coverings in classrooms. There has been no change to the requirement for adults to wear face coverings at drop off or pick up times or when coming onto the school site. Thank you for your ongoing co-operation and understanding with this protective measure. In addition, please remember to queue in single file when waiting at the gates in order to allow others to pass safely on the pavements; thank you.

This week, Miss Garrett and I have been busy interviewing for a range of vacancies here in school as we plan ahead for September. This has included thinking about classroom organisation and staffing for the start of Term One. We recognise that this time of change can be an anxious time for some children and parents. Due to the lateness of the resignation date for class teachers (31st May) and the implications of this I am not at present able to share this information with you. We will therefore endeavor to inform you of any changes as early as possible in Term 6, thus allowing time for a smooth transition for all involved. Please be assured as soon as that information is available you will all be the first to know!

A reminder that our final INSET Day of the year is on Friday 11 June when staff will be undertaking training in 'Talk for Reading'. School will therefore be closed to pupils on this day.

As part of the growing Forest School at Slade, we have purchased a six metre circular shelter for the children to use during their woodland sessions.

The shelter will need to be attached to a ridgeline high enough to go over a fire pit and it will need to be able to be easily taken down (using some kind of pulley system) when there are high winds forecast.



Miss Hall is asking our families and friends through the newsletter if they can, or know anyone who would be able to, help her construct the shelter.



Oak Academy Literacy Trust Author of the Week


Ben Miller

Actor and comedian Ben Miller is this week's Author of the Week. Miller (right) was first known to audiences on Channel 4 as part of a comedy duo with Alexander Armstrong and has since acted in films and appeared in all genres of TV programme, including the role of the much loved detective, Richard Poole, in the BBC comedy drama Death in Paradise.

It maybe a little less known, but Ben Miller is also an extremely popular and successful author, with a series of novels published over the last decade, with this week's free to listen to story from The Literacy Trust being one of the latest.


Registers are taken 10 minutes after the school gates close for your child's yeargroup.

COVID-19: Important Information

If your child shows symptoms of COVID-19 you should:

- HANDS FACE SPACE
- Stay at home, do not attend any other place out of the household. This applies to everyone in the household. Telephone 111 if you require advice
- Get a COVID-19 test for the symptomatic person, via the gov.uk website
- If the test comes back with a positive result, inform school immediately so we can invoke suitable measures. This can be via email if out of office hours, during the weekend or in the holidays:

Any individual or group sent a 10 day self isolation notification should continue their home learning via the familiar Microsoft Teams page, accessible though the school website and Teams App.
