



EYFS Year R: Growing and Moving On




We will be starting with The Very Hungry Caterpillar, and enjoying watching our own caterpillars grow and change into butterflies (hopefully!). We will then be designing bikes when we read Mrs Armitage on Wheels, and finishing the Year with some Pirate fun.

Year 1: By The Seaside

We will explore how the seaside landscape and some of the sea creatures are different from other places and talk about what things people do to enjoy themselves at the seaside. Also, we will be focusing on how our seaside holidays have changed since the 1970's.





Year 2: Animals, Humans and Plants

During the final term, Year 2 will cover two more themes in Science. These are Animals including Humans and Plants. They will also come up with ideas for a puppet and make these in Design Technology. Finally, Geography will provide the opportunity to compare another country to the UK.

Year 3: Earthquakes, Plants and Creating a Vlog

Next term our Geography topic will be all about Earthquakes. In Science, we will be learning about plants and using the outdoor environment as much as possible to investigate different plants. We will also have a focus on Computing and will attempt to create a vlog on a subject of our choice!


Registers are taken 10 minutes after the school gates close for your child's yeargroup.

COVID-19: Important Information

If your child shows symptoms of COVID-19 you should:

Despite recent relaxations as part of the Government's roadmap, COVID-19 restrictions are still in place in Tonbridge, the rest of Kent and across the whole of England.
