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





A poetry collection from Benjamin Zephaniah highlights the diversity of British society through its children.

Here are 12 poems, each one about a child in his or her home environment. Along with the poem comes a brief text explaining the child's background and history. The subjects include a Kurdistani refugee, a Chinese pop star wannabe, a Grenadan boy who loves cricket, and nine others.

The book's lesson, rendered in fun, inventive rhymes, is that kids are basically the same regardless of their background. Illustrated with Prodeepta Das' vibrant photographs.

We Are Britain! is a fascinating and fun collection.

# **COVID-19: Important Information**





If your child shows symptoms of COVID-19 you should:

- Stay at home, do not attend any other place out of the household. This applies to everyone in the household. Telephone 111 if you require advice
- Get a COVID-19 test for the symptomatic person, via the gov.uk website
- If the test comes back with a positive result, inform school immediately so we can invoke suitable measures. This can be via email if out of office hours, during the weekend or in the holidays: C19@slade.kent.sch.uk
