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

#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

Happy Friday everyone! I trust that you are well and have managed to survive the heat of the week!

Class bubbles this week have been making the most of our fabulous school grounds as they themselves sought to keep cool during the week too. They have enjoyed taking their learning outside whether that be training for the Slade Olympics, whittling wood in the Forest School or simply reading a story in the shade of the trees. Lovely!

As you are aware, the Prime Minister announced on Monday that the easing of the coronavirus restrictions in England would not be lifted on 21 June but instead would be delayed until 19 July. This decision has unfortunately impacted on some of the plans in place for the end of term. You will have already received a letter from me earlier this week outlining the decision to postpone the introduction of after school enrichment activities this term for this reason.

In addition, the Prime Minister's announcement and the directive that schools have since received from the Local Authority, will impact on the transition arrangements planned for those children leaving and joining Slade at the end of the academic year. Parents of children in Year 6 will be contacted directly by your child's secondary school with updates regarding transition arrangements for July. Here at Slade, changes are now having to be made to the induction plans for our new Reception children later this term; these arrangements will be shared with families next week. We look forward to welcoming our new children into the Slade family in the coming months!

To date, we have received no indication of what changes will be made to Department for Education (DfE) guidance for schools from September. The Senior Leadership Team are therefore planning ahead for all possibilities with regard to timetabling, including drop off/pick up arrangements and timings, in order that we can promptly share this information with parents as soon as guidance has been received. Watch this space!

We have also been planning the class and staffing arrangements for September with the aim of sharing this information with children and parents next Friday. As in previous years, you will receive a letter outlining any changes including notification of who your child's class teacher will be and information of some of the planned transition arrangements for the remainder of the term. All internal transition arrangements will be carried out safely in line with all current DfE guidance.

Finally, Public Health Kent have notified all headteachers of the increase in cases of COVID-19 in schools in recent days, with a growing number of schools having had to send significant numbers of pupils home to isolate. Thank you to all in our community for playing your part in following the government guidance and keeping to the protective measures as we work together to minimise the risk of this happening at Slade. Thank you.

I hope that you all have a lovely weekend; enjoy the football those of you that will be watching! Take care, stay safe and be kind x

## Prepared for Summer

Although the later part of this week has seen a return to the familiar sight of clouds and rain, we expect the sunshine and hotter weather to return next week and into July.

A reminder that on days where the sun is out and hotter temperatures are expected that all children should come to school with a sun hat and a full water bottle. Additionally, sun protection cream should be applied in the morning before drop off at school.

On Forest School days, the children will need to be wearing long sleeves and trousers even when the weather is very warm. This will help to protect them from stings, scratches and sunburn. Fortunately on the hotter days It is much cooler in Forest School under the trees. The children can wear wellies, sturdy boots or trainers when it is dry, but school shoes are not suitable.



#### In School Medication

There has recently been a large increase in requests to administer medication in school. We are able to carry out such requests at present, but please be mindful that most medication can be taken before school if it is a one dose per day prescription and if it is required three times a day this can normally be done before school, immediately after school and before bedtime to avoid unnecessary trips around school as we maintain our secure bubbles within the buildings.

We would like to remind all parents that we cannot give non prescribed medication such as liquid paracetamol and anti-histamine unless its an emergency.

## Year 6 Activity Week

Miss Laker was very excited to share the timetable of activities with the children and parents in Year 6, who are looking forward to their special week of fun in July, taking the place of the residential trip which was cancelled due to the ongoing pandemic.

Activities include trips out to Carroty Wood, Chessington and nearby Haysden Lake as well as other venues around town and in school. More details such as what to wear and bring as well as drop off and collection times were sent to parents in Year 6 earlier this week. 
The children should have a face mask with them for all of the events which can




## Oak Academy Literacy Trust Author of the Week

### Twin Superstars

On the eve of the Slade Olympic fortnight, we are incredibly pleased to share the fantastic sporting success of Year 6 twins, Ella and Eduardo.

Ella swims for the Junior County Development squad after impressing at Tonbridge Swimming Club based at neighbouring Tonbridge Swimming Pool.

And how she has impressed! Currently, Ella is the number 1 in Kent for the 50 metre freestyle event and 3rd across the county for the 50 metre butterfly. That's

not all; nationwide over 50 metres she is 23rd fastest in her age group for the freestyle (front crawl), 37th fastest for backstroke and 31st in England in the butterfly stroke.

Her brilliant sporting attitude is illustrated by her eagerness to continue to improve her technique and times even further and we were struck when talking to Ella, how modest she is in light of her successes, a true superstar now and for the future.

Ella will be representing her club at the Kent Weald Meeting being held in Dartford in July, we can't wait to hear how she gets on as she beats county times, aiming always for the next step and the national competitions.

Eduardo is also catching the eye on the sporting front, in his case on the football pitch.

He plays for Tonbridge Juniors Under 12's, who play on the Tonbridge Showground and recently took a successful trial at local Vanarama National League South side, Tonbridge Angels. He will be part of The Angels' Academy Squad next season.

Eduardo is described by those who have been fortunate to see him play as a central midfielder, performing as the 'rock' in front of the defence, offering the ultimate protection of his back line.

This is a great achievement for Eduardo, whose decision to go for a trial and his subsequent performance at Longmead has been rewarded; he will be attending his signing on ceremony in July.





Everyone at Slade would like to congratulate Ella and Eduardo on their achievements to date and wish them both much luck and further success in the immediate and longer term.

## Slade Olympics: 21 June - 2 July

The children across the school will be striving for their own Olympic sized fun and triumphs over the next two weeks. Mr Duffin is looking forward to the playing, competing, fun and learning that will accompany the Slade COVID friendly, but competitive series of sports events.



Next week we will see pupils from Year R, 1, 2, 3 and 4 take part in Team Sports, with Year 5 and 6 as well as the individual races happening the following week.

During this period, the classes will be learning all about the Olympics; every yeargroup will be given a different Games with a reason why it was special. The aim is for the children to be inspired to be passionate about the Olympics and about sport in general and in turn help to form an Olympics timeline to show off to the rest of the school running through the playground.

## **COVID-19: Important Information**





If your child shows symptoms of COVID-19 you should:

- If the test comes back with a positive result, inform school immediately so we can invoke suitable measures. This can be via email if out of office hours, during the weekend or in the holidays: C19@slade.kent.sch.uk
