

## This Week at Slade

### Slade Olympics Underway

The Slade Olympic fortnight is up and running after a rained delayed start.

This week has seen the start of the team events. On Tuesday Year 1 avoided the showers and Elf and Pixie Classes took part in a team game this afternoon which involved collecting different sized balls for different points. After a number of competitions Elf class beat Pixie class 202 points to 195. It was a closely fought match with all the children trying their best to gain points for their team.



In the Wednesday afternoon sunshine, Year 3 took to the field for a series of football and rounders matches. It was Mr Louth who took the bragging rights as his Pegasus Class swept to victory over Mrs Stephens and Mrs Berrill's Hippogriff Class. All of the matches took place in a friendly and sporting way The class teachers are proud of the effort of both classes.











Thursday saw Phoenix and Sprite playing bench ball, football and netball (above). Again, the children were quick to make sure that they were showing the Olympic values of Respect, Excellence, Friendship, Inspiration, Determination, Equality and Courage. Each yeargroup will be selecting a child who has shown each of these values during the events. The winners will be announced in a Celebration Assembly once the final events have taken place.

This morning, it was Year 2's turn. They played a superb game of Foot Rounders, which we hope you can imagine - it certainly sounds like lots of fun. Despite the rain clouds the game proved an instant hit with the children and with Miss Taylor and Miss Redden alike!



Next Week sees the end of the team sports, with Year 5 playing on Monday and Year 6 on Tuesday. In the event of bad weather, the events will happen on the next available day.

Please make sure that the children bring in a full water bottle, sunhat and PE kit if it is not already in school and to remember to apply sun lotion at home in the morning if the weather is expected to be sunny.

The Olympics will be completed on Thursday and Friday with the Individual Races. The races have been designed to minimise multiple contact with equipment. Due to the ongoing COVID-19 safety risk assessments in place across the school, we are not able to welcome in parents and carers for these events.

The classes in each yeargroup are either representing Green or Yellow; the points awarded throughout the Olympics will be totalled to provide one winning team who will be announced as soon as possible.

### Science Day



The Olympics will take a break on Thursday as Science Day is celebrated across the school. As part of this special day of learning, the children will be trying to find out 'Why Rainbows exist' and will also take a look at some unsung heroes, those women in science through the years.



### Going Green in Gruffalo

Continuing a very positive environmental theme developing in the newsletter, Mrs Taylor has talked to Gruffalo Class in EYFS about the litter picking she does.

The next week one of the class, Emma, drew as her holiday news, this super picture of her with her mum - again litter picking, this time along the river.

Thanks to Emma and her mum, the riverside walk was a cleaner more pleasant walk. Well done and thankyou Emma.

We are very proud of the litter picking going on by the children at Slade, we just wish there was no litter for them to pick! Can you think of different ways to persuade people not to drop their rubbish in a safe and appropriate place in the first place?

Gruffalo Class have also developed another environmentally friendly idea recently by starting their own compost bins for our fruit waste.



### **COVID-19: Important Information**

We have recently had a number of questions about what to do if a child exhibits any symptoms of COVID-19.



Current guidance suggests that any one of the main symptoms which are a high temperature (warm to touch, you do not need to have registered a temperature using a thermometer), a new continuous cough or a loss or change to sense of smell or taste – this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

If your child will be absent from school because of any one of these symptoms, make sure that:

- The child stays at home and does not attend any other place out of the household. This applies to everyone in the household including siblings who should not attend school. Telephone 111 if you are unsure if this applies to you
- Get a PCR Lab COVID-19 test for the symptomatic person, via the <u>gov.uk</u> website, telephoning 119 to organise a couriered test package or visiting the Test Centre opposite the school. You should not use the Lateral Flow Test for people who are showing symptoms.
- If the test comes back with a positive result, inform school immediately so we can invoke suitable measures. This can be via email if out of office hours, during the weekend or in the holidays: C19@slade.kent.sch.uk


