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
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
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Slade Primary School Newsletter 2020/21 Term 6 Issue 5 / Friday 9 July 2021









#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

As you are aware, the Prime Minister on Monday outlined the final roadmap step (Step 4) as we transition out of lockdown; subject to a final review of the data next week, legal restrictions will end on **Monday 19 July**. Following on from this announcement the DfE have since issued updated guidance to all schools outlining the implications for us of these changes for both the summer period (including holiday clubs) and from the start of the new academic year. We are currently awaiting additional guidance from the Local Authority in response to these changes.

The Senior Leadership Team have started to draft our own 'Slade roadmap', to ensure a smooth and safe transition out of lockdown for everyone in our school community in September. Once finalised, this plan will be shared with parents and carers in order that you can begin to prepare your child for the changes ahead. However, please note that all current bubble arrangements, including staggered start and finish times, will remain in place for the last 3 days of this term in order to minimise the risk of families needing to self-isolate at the start of the summer break.

Today was transition day across the school with all of the children enjoying spending time in their new classes and meeting their new teachers. There was a lovely hum of activity across the school as everyone settled into their new surroundings. It was good to see the children experiencing as many aspects as possible of the school day in preparation for September. Don't forget to talk to your child's current class teacher if you have any concerns around transition.

This week I have thoroughly enjoyed reading the end of year reports for every child in school; huge congratulations to all of the children on their achievements and progress during this exceptional of years! Reports have been modified to reflect the DfE guidance for report writing that was issued to schools earlier this year and therefore includes a comment on your child's engagement with remote learning in addition to the next steps for their learning in the next academic year. This year reports will be emailed out to you on Wednesday for pupils in EYFS and KS1 and on Thursday for KS2 classes, rather than a paper copy being sent.

A reminder that we will be holding a non uniform day on **Friday 16<sup>th</sup> July** for children in Years R-5. Children will be able to wear their own clothes to school for the day and make a voluntary contribution to the fundraising for the privilege of doing so! Year 6 will be enjoying their planned activity week and wearing their own clothes to school throughout the week so no donation required!



pictures and for all the work she puts in to help the school via the PTA and on the Governing Body.



A very big thankyou to mum Louise for sorting these books out, which will be in the library from September.



Each of the Houses at Tonbridge were set a range of challenges, lots involving local schools. In addition to visiting Slade, boys went out to Long Mead, Cage Green, Royal Rise, St Margaret Clitherow and Woodlands Schools as well as our friends at Hillview School and at Nexus School.

We were lucky to receive the help of a large group of boys from Welldon House, who in helping out with a number of tasks and improvements in Forest School - in doing so they unlocked a further £5000 for their appeal.
