COVID-19 Update

The Department for Education issued its new guidance for the management of COVID-19 cases in the school setting in the summer holidays. We continue to follow their guidance, which is always subject to change.

Your child is allowed to attend school in all circumstances unless they have received a positive result from a COVID test. If they have any of the symptoms associated with COVID-19, we strongly advise that they take a home Lateral Flow Test in order to protect themselves and their classmates and friends across the school.

Chickenpox, Measles and Shingles

We currently have children in the school who are receiving treatment which affects the immune system.

Everyone at Slade would like to ask all parents and carers to inform the school immediately if your child develops measles, chicken pox or if anyone in your household develops shingles.

This is as important at weekends and during school holidays as during the normal school week. Please email in the normal way to office@slade.kent.sch.uk to inform us of any cases of measles, chickenpox or shingles in your household. Any notifications will be treated in strictest confidence.

Your own child is not at any risk whatsoever from this situation. However, the health and wellbeing of our pupils is paramount and we depend on the co-operation of all of the school community to support us in this matter.



KS2 Swimming Lessons Return



We are very happy that our programme of swimming lessons for all Key Stage 2 children has restarted after the enforced COVID break. Each class from Year 3 to 6 will have 6 sessions at Tonbridge Swimming Pool during the year as part of their statutory PE lessons.

Year 5 class Dragon had their first session yesterday, with Wyvern Class following on Monday. Massive thanks to every parent in Dragon who signed up in advance of the lessons. Buster is Back!


We are delighted to say that we have renewed our partnership with Buster's Book Club for another year.

The reading incentive scheme organised by the Kent Messenger Charity Team is designed to help children reach reading targets for their age group.

Each child will be coming home with their Autumn Term bookmark shortly. All we ask for you to do at home is to mark the number of minutes that your child has read on a chosen day each week. It doesn't matter which day you record, but the figures are collated in school each Wednesday.

There are class prizes up for grabs each week - over the course of the last three years, classes at Slade have been the lucky recipients of Buster's special prize a number of times, including a class trip to KidZania London and a Science Activity Day.

It doesn't matter what your child reads; school book, library book, magazine or anything else that catches their reading imagination at home. Each week Mrs Mawson will award the class of the week as part of Friday's celebration assembly. Winners are also announced on our Twitter account live from the assembly. The winning class in KS1 takes away the Buster's Bear and the KS2 Winners of the Week are awarded the glass trophy (both below).

Mrs Mawson is very pleased to say that the School Library will swing open its doors to each class again during Term 1.


Each class will have a half hourly slot once a week for children to browse the selection of books and choose one to take, read and enjoy.
