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Dear Parents and Carers,

There was another return to 'normality' this week as we began the roll out of reading books across the school with children in Year 1 to be the first year group to bring home books from the school's Big Cat reading scheme. We will require a small number of parent helpers to escort us to the church; more details to follow, including information about our food collections, next week.

Parent Consultation meetings for Term 1 will proceed as planned on 19 and 21 October and will remain as a virtual meeting with your child's new class teacher. This will be an opportunity for you to meet with the teacher, albeit remotely, and discuss how your child has settled into the new year. This can be done by telephoning the school office to arrange an appointment at a mutually convenient time or by emailing the class email address.

Without doubt, the love of reading amongst the children across Slade continues to flourish. The library is fully stocked, bolstered by a number of brand new books that have been bought out of our National Book Tokens win a couple of years ago and from incredibly kind donations from parents past and present, including a number from our pupils now in Year 7, who left us for secondary school in the summer.

This year, due to an obvious demand, we have decided to extend the role of Junior Librarians to include all yeargroups in KS2 rather than just Year 6. There were no shortage of applicants, so the children will be taking turns on a termly basis, with one yeargroup a day helping Mrs Mawson each lunchtime.

The role includes preparing all of the books and making sure the library is neat and tidy so that visitors and class groups can easily use the facility as well as scanning any books that are being borrowed and returned.

All of the volunteers have taken to their tasks very well this week; we caught up with the Year 4 Junior Librarians on Tuesday afternoon.

The group of 4: Charlotte, Zac, Leo and Bridget were put in charge of some brand new science books. They had to stamp the inside cover with the school logo and learn how to scan the books in and out of the library. They all enjoyed their first session with Mrs Mawson and having the responsibility of looking after the books.

For Charlotte it was an extra special treat as she, 'absolutely loves the smell of new books!' We totally agree, Charlotte!


