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Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been so heartwarming to hear the sound of singing return this week as a chorus of harvest song rehearsals have echoed across the school buildings. A welcome return to times pre-covid!

It has also been lovely to have all 60 of our Reception children in full time this week, experiencing a whole week of full days in school for the first time! It has been great to see them exploring the learning opportunities available to them both inside and out including venturing further than their classrooms at times! Some of the children have made it into the hall for PE and even down to the woods for their first ever Forest School too! Well done Elmer and Gruffalo!

Well done too to Pixie and Elf Classes who this week experienced their first ever assembly in the main school hall! The children joined the Year 6 classes for Monday's whole school hybrid assembly which sees two year groups come together in the hall whilst the rest of the school Zoom in from their classes. Each week a different year group gets to join Year 6, who set the example of assembly behaviours and expectations, as we re-introduce all the children to those routines that used to be so familiar! We are looking forward to welcoming Year 2 into the hall on Monday!

A reminder to all parents that attendance for pupils is mandatory with the expectation that all pupils attend school daily. We recognize the times in which we currently live and the impact that Covid is having within families; however, there has been a marked increase in recent weeks of children being absent from school for non-medical reasons. There has also been an increase in the number of requests for absence, primarily for holidays; absence in term time can only be authorized in exceptional circumstances and any request for a term time holiday will not be authorised. Following the school closures over the last 12 months and the impact that this has had on learning it is more important than ever that your child is attending school. We would therefore urge all parents and carers to think carefully before submitting any absence requests and consider the implications that this might have on your child's progress, both socially and academically. Increasingly in school we are having to spend time dealing with the repercussions from the online activity of children outside of the school day, particularly in Key Stage 2. The governors recently held their first Full Governing Body meeting of the new school year. Much of this meeting is procedural which involves the appointment of governors to various roles and the adoption of a number of policies.

The following appointments were made at this meeting:

Chair of Governors - Simon Griffiths Chair of Finance and Property Committee and Vice-Chair of Governors – David Evans Chair of Curriculum Committee – Scott Miller Chair of Personnel and Professional Development Committee – Stuart Concannon

In line with best practice, all these appointments are for one year. In addition, David Evans and Claire Pearson were elected to new four-year terms as governors. Both Claire and David are experienced governors having already served two 4-year terms and the governors thanked them for their continued commitment to the school.

The governors also reviewed the schools Self Evaluation and School Development Plan. These are important documents which assess the performance of the school and areas for further development. The governors endorsed both documents which, as you would expect, have a strong emphasis on ensuring all children make-up for their time out of the classroom during the pandemic, with particular focus on our disadvantaged children and those with additional needs.

The governors are looking forward to the year ahead as we continue to work with the school's stakeholders to ensure your children receive the best education possible. Not Feeling Well?

Please remember to contact the school office via email to <u>office@slade.kent.sch.uk</u> or on the telephone to 01732 350354, choosing Option 1 on each day of absence, unless on the second of the days off following sickness or diarrhoea or you are on a period of self isolation following a positive COVID-19 test where we know the expected end date of absence.

We should be notified of a days illness by 08:30 each morning to satisfy our statutory safeguarding expectations.

<u>COVID-19</u>

If your child is exhibiting any of the presently recognised COVID-19 symptoms:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

The advice from Public Health England and the NHS is that even if the symptoms are mild, you should:

- Get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab) to check if they have COVID-19 as soon as possible.
- Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the test result

Please continue to let us know if you have ordered a PCR test and the subsequent result when available.
