These are sessions for parents and carers to meet informally with the school leadership team to discuss an area of school life in order to identify both things that are working well and areas where improvements could be made. Although we are not yet at the stage to meet in person we will be re-introducing these forums remotely this term. Signing Choir Practise to Perform

Mrs Martin was thrilled to restart her Signing Choir yesterday. Before the pandemic, our signing choir was going from strength to strength, performing at our in school events and wider afield in the community.

At this time, the choir is open to children in Year 3, with the hope that we will be able to safely give the opportunity to join to all children later in the year. Mrs Martin, who is our superstar signer and British Sign Language NVQ Level 6 qualified also runs a signing choir outside of school for adults in her local area was delighted that nearly half the yeargroup joined her at lunchtime to start their first practise together.





They plan to learn to sign two songs this term, the first of which is Somewhere Only We Know by Lily Allen, made famous by the 2016 John Lewis Christmas advert.

Mrs Martin told us that learning to sign a song is a great introduction to the language, which will also build the children's awareness and confidence. This in turn will enable them to be able to be able to communicate in BSL with each other and the deaf community in and out of school.



We watched the session and it was obvious that all of the children really enjoyed themselves whilst learning the signs to the lyrics of Lily Allen's song.

We look forward to seeing how practise progresses over the weeks and hopefully see the choir perform soon.

EYFS22: Starting Primary School in September 2022

Today sees the opening of the window for applications to be made for children starting primary school in Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS, Year R) in September 2022. Applications will be made for children born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018.

We have been really happy to see many families join us on recent tours of the school in preparation to make their applications. This is the first time since the outbreak of COVID-19 that this has been possible and it has been lovely being able to show first time parents around Slade.

Applications should be made via the Kent County Council website where you have the chance to list in preference order, upto three schools.

Congratulation to the winners of the pumpkin carving competition - Dexter and Daisy from Sprite and Elmer Classes (left).








The event was enjoyed by children and adults from across the community and it was great to be able to welcome you all!
