This is one of the reasons, that 'One Kind Word' has been chosen as the theme of Anti-Bullying Week taking place from 15 to 19 November 2021.

Following the success of the campaign in 2020 – when a jaw-dropping 80% of schools marked the week reaching over 7.5 million children and young people - the Anti-Bullying Alliance (which coordinates the campaign each year in England and Wales) asked over 400 young people, teachers, and parents, what they wanted from this year's Anti-Bullying Week. Again and again, the young and not-so-young told us they wanted anti-bullying work to be about hope and the positive and kind things we can do to halt hurtful behaviour in its tracks.

Procedure if your child is unwell

If your child is not well and not able to come to school then we ask that parents telephone the school office on 01732 350354 everyday of their child's absence. With the current COVID pandemic, please follow government guidelines, but please still let us know if your child will be absent from school. If they are having to self-isolate but are well, then they will need to be taking part in home learning.

Reading Cloud is a library management system with an innovative online pupil engagement community which helps schools promote reading for pleasure and helps children develop positive attitudes to reading to become lifelong readers.

Reading Cloud makes it easier for parents to get involved with and support your child's reading from home. With Reading Cloud, you can:

Access your child's School Library

From any computer, smartphone, tablet and help your child choose what to read next.

Help your child with Book Reviews

Review books from home and give them a star rating. This is a great feature for developing their literacy and writing skills

Track your child's Reading progress

View their past book loans and see what they are currently reading.

Create Video Reviews

A fun and interesting way of getting involved with your child's reading progress.

Find out what they like to read

Help your child pick their next book with the help of 'Who Next' which recommends books based on what they have previously read, looking at similar authors and genres.

Create a Wish List

Search the school library catalogue to see which books are in stock before you buy new titles for your child at home
