Slade Primary School

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Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been a busy first full week of term with lots of exciting learning happening across the school!

The start of the week saw two runaway Gingerbread Men on the loose in the main school building, both of which were skilfully intercepted by Miss Garrett and I and safely delivered to the children in Elmer and Gruffalo classes! Gingerbread Men sorted, we were then alerted to a couple of life-size tigers holding a tea party in Year 1! On further investigation there were indeed a couple of tigers enjoying a pot of tea with the children (aka Miss Elliott and Mrs Hill!) Many thanks to all of the staff who have enabled these experiences to happen this week for our younger children to bring their learning to life!



On Monday, each year group will be sending out an overview of key information regarding the learning that will be happening in your child's class this term. I would encourage each of you to take the time to read these in the coming days to ensure that you have all the necessary information required for the term, enabling you to support your child with their learning during the coming weeks. Thank you in advance for taking the time to take a look.

On Wednesday this week, we welcomed Chris Jacobs our Local Authority School Improvement Adviser to the school for his first visit this year. Chris spent time with myself and Miss Garrett followed by sessions with both Phase Leaders and Curriculum Team Leaders to find out more of how our curriculum has developed since September. His visit also included a virtual catch up with Simon Griffiths, Chair of Governors, to hear of all that has been achieved in recent times. He was hugely impressed by what he heard and saw stating that Slade is a "really strong school." Well done and thank you to all the children and staff involved! You too can find out more about our school development and priorities by attending our virtual Open Morning next week.

We continue to see an increase in requests for absence during term time. A reminder that the school attendance policy can be found on the school website and also includes information regarding requests for absence in term time and why such absences will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. In addition, remote learning is only provided for children who cannot attend school for Covid related reasons and will not be provided for children on holiday during term time. Finally, from Monday 17 January, children who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to school immediately on day 6. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. Over the Christmas and New Year holiday, the school was fitted out with a new telephone system. Part of the benefits of the system is the ability to be transferred directly to some of our key functions across the school, with answerphone facilities available if it is not possible to speak at the time you call. - 1: Details of a child's absence (this is a leave-a-message facility, picked up by staff in the school office)
- 2: Finance (this will be answered by Mrs Toft, Finance Officer, there is a message facility in Mrs Toft's absence)
- **3: Inclusion Leader's Team** (this will be answered by Mrs Barber or Mrs Young, there is a message facility in their absence)
- **4: Family Liaison Team** (this will be answered by Mrs Button or Mrs Ekperigin, there is a message facility in their absence)
- **5: Kitchen** (this will be answered by Mrs Derrick or a member of the kitchen team, there is a message facility in their absence)

Hold: To speak to the school office just hold the line and you will be automatically transferred to a member of the school office team.

Starting School in September 2022

The deadline for making applications to start primary school in September 2022 closes on Monday 17 January.

If your child was born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018 you should make an application to start school in the Early Years Foundation Stage Reception Year (Year R).

This includes families who already have a family sibling connection to their preferred school (children in the current Year R to Year 5). If you have made a sibling application for a place at Slade, please let us know via

admissions@slade.kent.sch.uk if you haven't already. This helps with the validation process required of us in the next few weeks.

Spotting Sepsis in Children



Sepsis is an emergency medical condition where the immune system overreacts to an infection. It affects people of all ages and, without urgent treatment, can lead to organ failure and death. Crucially, sepsis is often treatable if caught quickly, so it's really important to be Sepsis Savvy and to just ask: 'could it be sepsis?'
