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From the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

Many thanks to those parents, carers and governors who attended the school's first online Open Morning on Wednesday where the Senior Leadership Team and Chair of Governors shared the main priorities for the school, including our long-term strategic plan, and discussed the main features of our School Development Plan. We hope those of you that came found it informative and gave you an insight into a typical day at school. Thank you too for the feedback that you have shared both during the session and following the event. If you were unable to attend and would still like to view the presentation a recording was made and is available on request by emailing the school office at the usual address, naming your message 'SLT Presentation' in the subject heading. A link to the recorded session will then be emailed out to you. Thank you in anticipation of you taking the time to watch!

A reminder, as mentioned in last week's newsletter, an overview of key information regarding the learning that will be happening in your child's class this term was sent to you at the start of the week. Once again I would encourage you to take a look if you haven't yet had chance to do so. Following which, should you have any concerns or queries about your child or their learning then please do arrange a time to discuss these with your child's class teacher by contacting them via the class email address or by telephoning the school office to arrange a telephone appointment at a mutually convenient time.

As you will be aware, on Wednesday the Prime Minister announced that all Plan B measures will be removed in England, with a full return to Plan A by Thursday 27 January. For us as a school this means that face coverings will no longer be required to be worn in communal areas by staff and visitors to the school. Therefore, as of Thursday 27 January parents are no longer required to wear face coverings at drop off and pick up times. In addition, all school staff on gate duty at these times will no longer be requested to wear face coverings should they choose not to. However, the guidance for schools states that the wearing of masks could be reintroduced at any time under the advice of local directors of public health should the school experience a localised outbreak. All other remaining protective measures in school, as outlined in our risk assessment, remain in place and under constant review on a daily basis.

It has been lovely this week to spend time with some of our Reception parents who have been enjoying a Covid-friendly tour of the school, seeing from the outside the buildings and grounds that they've not seen before due to the restrictions that were in place at the time of applying for school places. It has also hopefully provided an insight into a typical school day and all that is available for our pupils beyond Reception; all of this without entering the building! Thank you for coming to take a look; we look forward to meeting more of you at the remaining tours in the coming weeks.

Following feedback from the parent community, we are currently in the process of finalising details for the introduction of class representatives ('Class Reps') for all classes across the school in order to strengthen the partnership between parents and the school team. If this is something which you feel you might be interested in then watch this space for further information which will outline what the role involves.

In the meantime I look forward to seeing many of you at this term's PTA meeting next Thursday online at 7.30pm.

Please join the PTA as we discuss our Christmas successes, the trim trail and upcoming events including the Easter Egg Hunt and Summer Fête.

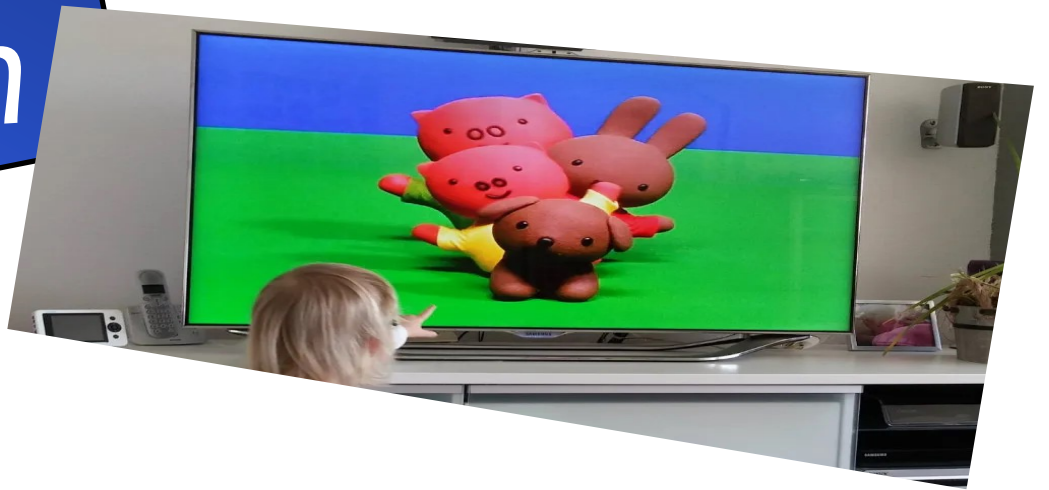

What to Watch



See Hear Special for Children

Every child and adult at Slade is acutely aware of the positive role the deaf community have in our school, his programme is a must watch for anyone with an interest in how the children in classes across schools like Slade and in our Titans Class are able to access learning in this spin off programme, Deaf, Little and Loud, that aims to show how the use of BSL within the classroom setting is extremely beneficial. Enjoy being a fly on the wall and follow the adventures of 8 children and their teachers during a normal school day.



The programme makers have this to say:



‘Deaf children are still falling behind their hearing peers in school. This See Hear special, presented by Radha Starr (left) investigates the importance of access to sign language from a young age. For the first time in the programme’s history, cameras are rigged in a primary school classroom with deaf children to see how well they respond to a series of exercises led by Alysha Allen, a renowned deaf teacher, and observed by two guest experts, Dr Kate Rowley and Dr Patrick Rosenberg.

We learn the importance of facial expressions and communication between teachers and deaf students, and we witness a full immersive education experience as Alysha leads a series of exercises ranging from storytelling to building blocks. In between the tasks, we go home with some of the participants to find out more about their backgrounds and family lives.’

Social Media Usage for Children: Safeguarding Advice

There are lots of social media websites and apps people use to chat, comment, share pictures and game with their friends.

Many parents and carers wonder when is the best age to let their child have a social media account. Some don’t want their children to have underage accounts. Others may have decided their child is not quite ready for social networking, even if their child is begging them. Once children reach secondary school, they’re likely to come under growing peer pressure to stay in touch with friends online.

ThinkUKnow is a website designed to help parents and carers answer these questions and more, including how to let your child get the most out of the internet in a safe, secure way.

The ThinkUKnow website is produced and supported by the The National Crime Agency and the Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre (CEOP) who work with safeguarding and child protection partners across the UK and overseas. It protects children from harm online and offline with a focus on child sexual exploitation and online protection issues.

Procedure if your child is unwell

Spotting Sepsis in Children



Sepsis is an emergency medical condition where the immune system overreacts to an infection. It affects people of all ages and, without urgent treatment, can lead to organ failure and death. Crucially, sepsis is often treatable if caught quickly, so it's really important to be Sepsis Savvy and to just ask: 'could it be sepsis?' Use the leaflet from the link below if you're concerned about someone's symptoms, especially if their illness seems unlike anything they've had before, and they're 'just not right' – even if their temperature falls again.
