Who Am I?



Yesterday, we held our first ever Who Am I? Day - a special event designed for the children and adults in school to show each other clothing or an item which helps to describe them and their cultural background, be that their family's ethnicity, religion or history, or their main passion in life which shows what they do and love outside of school.

Over the next two pages we are proud to share with you some of the pictures we took across the day, including this piece by Victoria in Sphinx Class, who along with mum and Teaching Assistant, Mrs Vokes, came to school in their traditional Burmese outfits:

Hello, I am Victoria. I am half Burmese and half British. My mum was born in Mandalay, Burma. She speaks fluent Burmese language. In this photograph we are wearing our Burmese traditional clothing. My one is from the ethnic group called Shan in Burma and my mum is wearing traditional Burmese costume made with cotton and embroidered with handmade beads. You can also see that I am wearing traditional Burmese sun protection paste called Thanaka. Thanaka is a paste made from ground bark of tree. It is a distinctive feature of the culture of Burma.

I will always be proud of who I am.



In Gruffalo Class Mrs Satbhai wore her North Indian suit, whilst the children represented different nations with different clothes, from left to right: The British Queen, An angel from Russia and their very own 'Baby Bok' from South Africa.

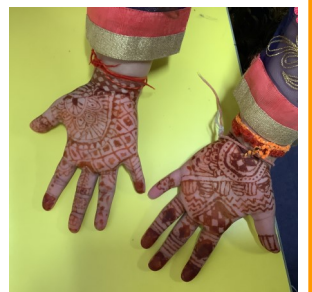

The puppets are from Indonesia and are called Wayang or Wajang which means shadow. Shadows from the puppets are created by lighting a screen from behind. They were first used in the 10th Century in Indonesia.

Covid-19 vaccinations for clinically-vulnerable 5 to 11-year-olds

NHS Kent and Medway

The NHS in Kent and Medway is now offering the Covid-19 vaccine to eligible children aged five to eleven years-old who:

- are at higher risk from coronavirus due to **underlying health conditions** or
- share living accommodation, on most days, with someone who has a **weakened immune system**

If you have an eligible child, you will be invited to bring them to have the vaccine by their GP practice, a local vaccination service linked to their GP practice, or the NHS School-Aged Immunisation Service (SAIS).


