Kent Schools Trampolining Championship

On Wednesday morning, we walked away with a superb second place in the team event at the Kent Schools Trampolining Championships, held at the Jumpers Rebound Centre in Gillingham, home of the Jumpers Trampolining Club.

The competition was incredibly tough, but our team of Francesca in Pegasus Class, Momo and Charlotte (both of Griffin Class) successfully showed their abilities in front of the judges and the rest of the competitors in the hall to eventually take second place on the podium.



The girls had to perform a strict routine, set down by the competition organisers which included ten moves, where no 'extra in between' bounces are allowed. So the competitor has to move seamlessly between moves, remembering the next one well in advance whilst not 'drifting' away from the centre of the trampoline at any time.

Scores were given for the neatness of the execution and the movement around the trampoline, called Horizontal Displacement.

Congratulations to Francesca, Momo and Charlotte for an outstanding achievement - bearing in mind the little, if no, time that they had to practice on a full sized trampoline.

He came a very respectable 319th with his team coming 9th overall. James still has another two years of competing in this age category and is already looking forward to running even faster in 2023!



Girls On The Way to Culverden!

Mrs Ball and Mr Duffin had the pleasure of taking two girls football teams to the Tonbridge and Tunbridge Wells schools football tournament at Hayesbrook School on Wednesday evening.

The tournament has the title of 'Road to Culverden' as Wednesday's set of matches were the qualifying rounds, aiming to reach the final of the cup, to be held at Culverden Stadium, home of Tunbridge Wells FC.



We are all absolutely delighted to say that both squads (Year 4 and the other in the tournament for Years 5 and 6) both qualified for the finals in spectacular fashion, with only one defeat in 8 games between them.

The main aspect of the girls in both teams play was their teamwork. They have been training together at school and carried on the team spirit through the matches at Hayesbrook. Playing as a team, rather than relying on one individual performance. It was this that saw them victorious against teams from (Year 4) Hilden Oaks, St Johns School and St James School and for the older yeargroups vs Yalding, Hildenborough, Chiddingstone and the Slade double against St Johns in Tunbridge Wells. The only reverse came against favourites Claremont School.

After the 'round-robin' format, the top two teams from each group of four teams (there were 2 groups for each year) qualified for the finals day. In both cases, the Slade teams qualified for finals day; the Year 5 and 6 team in second place and the undefeated Year 4 team in first place.



Congratulations to all of the girls who took part and many thanks to all of the parents who helped by taking the teams to Hayesbrook, and offered great support to the girls in every match.
