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Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been lovely to be back in the building this week catching up with children and staff following my brief Covid absence. Year 1, Life Long Ago

Pixie and Elf Classes had a fantastically fun learning experience yesterday morning as they hosted Chris and James and some very special guests from Education Group.

This term, Year 1 have been learning all about Life Long Ago, including the dinosaur era on Earth. They have understood how dinosaurs lived and about the different types of dinosaurs that we now believe existed on our planet many millions of years ago.

All of the children spent the first part of Thursday morning out in the sunshine of the playground as they found out from the fun learning style of the presenters from Education Group quite how long ago it was that dinosaurs were on Earth. They used the lines on the playground to imagine a timeline and they could see the small portion of time that humans have been the dominant species of the planet. Simply put, they learnt the chronology of the history of the world!



They then met a little dinosaur and had the chance to stroke him and learn about what a dinosaur may feel like. This was just before they were introduced to Sophie, the T-Rex! Followers of our Twitter feed will have already met the giant who mesmerized

all of Year 1 (and Year 6 who were completing their Daily Mile at the time as well as Hippogriff Class who had a very different view from their classroom window for the morning!)

Meeting Sophie gave the children a chance to see the difference in size of dinosaurs as they could try to imagine life on the planet with these huge beasts roaming wild.



Following a short break, the classes took turns to visit the main hall to learn about fossils and quite how we know all of the information we do about life so long ago. Chris described the work of scientists and historians and in particular, Paleontologists whose job is to be able to identify a fossil and build their knowledge into being able to show all the characteristics of how the dinosaur would have lived. They loved to find out that a paleontologist can use a fossil of dinosaur poo to find out what they would have eaten - even after all of these years!



Pixie and Elf Classes were pleased to be able to share their own knowledge and that they had picked up from their lessons over the term. They were able to quickly recall the difference between Herbivores and Carnivores as well as being able to identify various sea creatures that were around at the time.

They finished their workshop by being able to search the sands for real fossils, using the information boards provided to be paleontologists themselves and detecting what creature it was from.

Many thanks to both Chris and James from Education Group for producing and presenting such a fun, engaging morning for all of the children which has certainly enhanced and complimented their learning and understanding of this subject.

Kent Boccia Finals: Maidstone YMCA

In a week of firsts, we were proud to be involved in our first ever Boccia tournament in Maidstone on Tuesday.

Boccia is a target ball sport which tests both muscle control and accuracy. From a seated position, players propel balls to land as close as possible to a white marker ball, known as the Jack. Two sides compete as individuals, pairs or as a team of three over a set number of ends (4 for individuals and pairs, and 6 for teams).



We had two teams who played ten matches, with both producing excellent performances and results against teams from across the county including Greenfields, Five Acre Wood, Helen Alison, The Beacon Academy and the Hartsdown Academy. One of our teams completed their tournament undefeated.

Our players have been practising their Boccia skills during their Slade Champions Club on a Thursday evening at school and took everything they had learnt to the matches they played together.

Congratulations to everyone who competed so well for our school!

A massive thanks to all of the parents who have helped to ferry the children to all of these events and for your wonderful support for all of our players during the matches as well as the invaluable help you have offered to Mrs Ball at the tournaments; we are very grateful.
