Great News For Our Deaf Community

Everyone at Slade joins over 151,000 users of British Sign Language in celebrating the news earlier this week, that BSL is to become a recognized language in law in England. Member of Parliament Rosie Cooper (Labour, West Lancashire) who proposed the bill and has worked tirelessly for its passing into law explains that her Bill recognises BSL as a language in its own right and requires the Government to produce guidance on promoting and protecting its use throughout public bodies.



The BSL Act will recognise BSL as a language of England, Wales and Scotland in its own right. It is also supported by a duty on the Secretary of State for the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) to regularly report on what each relevant government department has done to promote or facilitate the use of British Sign Language in its communications with the public.

The Act further places a requirement on the DWP Secretary of State to issue guidance to departments on the promotion and facilitation of BSL. The guidance will be developed together with D/deaf BSL signers.

Minister for Disabled People, Health and Work Chloe Smith MP said: Today is a momentous day and I truly hope it will transform the lives of D/deaf people across the country. The BSL Bill will help remove barriers faced by the D/deaf community in daily life and is a further welcome step towards a more inclusive and accessible society. I am so grateful to the efforts of Rosie Cooper MP and the wonderful campaigners who have brought the BSL Bill to the point of passing into law and I'm proud to have played a small part in its journey.

Rosie Cooper MP said: At long last, the Deaf community will be able to say that their language is legally recognised. Working across party lines and with the Deaf community, I really believe we have made history by creating a mechanism for Deaf people to achieve equal access to public services. Their voices will be heard loud and clear and there will be no excuse for failing to respect BSL as a language. The hard work doesn't stop here however, but the door is now open for the Deaf community make real progress fixing the injustices that they continue to face.

David Buxton, Chair of the British Deaf Association, said: We are extremely pleased to see the UK Parliament finally vote to recognise British Sign Language as a language of Great Britain in law today, after 19 long years of campaigning. Today is a historic day for the Deaf community in the UK, and an inspiration for other countries around the world where the national sign language has not yet been recognised in law. The British Deaf Association looks forward to working hand in hand with the government and civil servants to implement and monitor the progress of the BSL Act 2022. While today is a day to celebrate, we are aware that this marks the first step on a long path towards providing truly equal access to public services, information and opportunities for Deaf BSL users in Great Britain.

Mark Atkinson, Chief Executive at RNID, said: RNID and our supporters join with the Deaf community today to celebrate this historic moment as British Sign Language passes the final hurdle before it is legally recognised in England, Wales and Scotland. We're immensely proud to have worked alongside other deaf organisations and parliamentarians to support this campaign. We look forward to the BSL Bill getting Royal Assent soon and to working with the government to make sure the BSL Act makes a real difference to the lives of Deaf people in the UK. The Third Reading of the BSL Bill takes place today in the House of Lords and following this it will receive Royal Assent.

The BSL Bill was first introduced on 16 June 2021 and passed through the House of Commons on 17 March 2022, receiving unanimous cross-party support.

Lunchtimes at Slade span from midday through to 13:30 as the children enjoy a well earned break, refuel and a stretch of legs before they embark on their afternoon sessions. Lunchtime for the younger children in EYFS and KS1 is from 12 to 1 and for the children in KS2, between 12:30 and 13:30. This allows for there to be plenty of space on the playground for the children to safely run, walk, sit and talk whilst also allowing a smooth flow of yeargroups into the main hall to be served with their choice of Nourish meal or to tuck into their packed lunch for the day. We operate table service, with the children being handed the plate of their choice, made during registration time in the morning.


Doing the serving and supervising both in the hall and back out on the playground and field during the lunch period are our team of nine Lunchtime Supervisors. Amongst this number is Marian Barlow, who also works at school as a Teaching Assistant. We caught up with Marian last week to discuss the role of the Lunchtime Supervisor.

How would you describe the role of a Lunchtime Supervisor?

To look after and safeguard children at lunch whilst creating a happy atmosphere and dealing with any minor incidents which inevitably happen as well as basic first aid. Fortunately, there are less injuries at this time of year because it is summertime and we can all get back down on the school field.

Where did you go to school?

I attended St Margaret Clitherow School, which I enjoyed thoroughly. My children went to Hildenborough School.



Do you remember the lunchtime staff at your primary school?

I do! There was a really strict Dinner Lady (the title back in the day) called Mrs Lenahan. Everyone was really scared of her; I think it was just her 'snappy' manner and lack of smile! I met Mrs Lenahan about twenty years after leaving school and I must say, she was delightful and she was lovely to me!



The Dinner Ladies would always make me eat sweetcorn, which always filled me with dread!

You have other roles at Slade, does this help you when you with you are wearing your Lunchtime Supervisor 'hat'?

Yes. Basically, I know the children, they know me and we are all aware of the school's expectations. We are also able to use our experience in the classroom to use the same language and techniques used by the teachers so that the children have a consistent approach which makes understanding what needs to happen much easier and successful.



Everyone enjoys the summertime when we can all go down to the field. There is so much more space to run without fear of knocking into anyone!

Procedure if your child is unwell

If your child is not well and not able to come to school then we ask that parents telephone the school office on 01732 350354 **everyday** of their child's absence. With the current COVID pandemic, please follow government guidelines, but please still let us know if your child will be absent from school. If they are having to self-isolate but are well, then they will need to be taking part in home learning.
