
<u>Year 6 Out For a Curry</u>

Griffin and Hydra Classes have spent the latter part of the week sharing time at neighbouring Tonbridge School, with kind use of their Cooking Classrooms to prepare, make, eat and enjoy a vegetable curry that they have been planning in class during the term.

The children have learnt independence in a kitchen environment and found out the best way to use utensils such as vegetable peelers and how to safely handle food, before tasting for themselves the fresh benefits of eating fresh produce cooked up by themselves! Sunshine Summer at Slade

As we are coming into warmer weather season (hopefully), we thought it would be a good





idea to talk about the sun.

In and around the school we have many shady areas that the children can shelter in the hotter days. However, it is still sensible to take some precautions during the warmer days.

Therefore, could we ask parents to please remember to bring in a sun hat for the children, apply long lasting sun cream in the mornings and make sure their children have their water bottles with them every day.

In some circumstances and following discussion with your child's class teacher it may be necessary for your child to bring in suncream to school to reapply independently in the middle of the day. This must have their name clearly labelled on the bottle and the teacher informed.

Due to recent developments concerning some ingredients of specific suncreams, we ask that you check them to see if they contain any kind of nut oil or nut milk. This is important as we are a nut free school with a number of children and adults with live nut allergies.

Girls in Green Bring Back The Double!

The Road to Culverden is the branding of the Tonbridge, Tunbridge Wells and West Kent Sports Partnership's football tournament for primary schools in the region. The road, as it happens leads directly to the Culverden Stadium, home of SECFL Premier League side Tunbridge Wells FC.

The Royals were hosts for the finals of the tournament, which started with qualifiers with 39 girls teams and 42 boys teams playing at local secondary schools in the last few months - ours took place at Hayesbrook School.

We qualified in three of the sections: Year 5/6 boys and girls and Year 3/4 girls.

The boys team played well and finished 4th overall as losing semi-finalists in the competition won by St James' School in Tunbridge Wells, who were themselves inspired by a player with close connections to Slade; the son of Elmer Class teacher and EYFS Leader Natalie Pearson!

And then the girls took to the field.



Our Year 3 and 4 girls team were unbeaten throughout the tournament. Football's newest 'Invincibles' won the final on penalties against an excellent Yalding side. The winning penalty was scored by Sophie, with vital saves in the shoot-out from Olivia.

Our girls squad on the day was Victoria, Olivia, Sophie, Violet, Keeva and Mia.

The Year 5 and Year 6 girls team battled so well as a team throughout







qualifying and in the finals at Culverden, by the end of the tournament you could see the confidence oozing from their performances, they eventually triumphed with a 1:0 victory in the final match, with a goal from Tabitha enough to defeat Claremont School. There were fantastic performances across the field, notably from goalkeeper April who did what all great keepers do - maintain concentration and when called upon, to produce the match winning saves.

The squad of Tapasya, Charlotte, Momo, Tabitha, Ellie, Emi and April lift the trophy to cement our double win of the morning.
