Local Road Safety

We are incredibly lucky that most of our families can walk, scoot or ride to school. Safety for those on foot when on the way to and from school will always be a priority for us.

With this in mind, please be extra careful when walking or riding on the streets surrounding the school, especially during busy times. One area of concern are the newer roads that more families are now able to use, in particular: Annison Street, Bradley Street and Exchange Court between school and the High Street.

These are all working roads and although quiet, still see a number of vehicles both parked up on either side and delivery drivers going about their work, sometimes unaware of the reduced speed limit of 20. Everyone should be aware that the normal road dangers are present here as well.

Please remember to take care to stay safe on the road, especially if children are travelling on their own.

Year 6 Wellbeing Workshop

Miss Lidlow and Mrs Burnside were happy earlier this week, to facilitate an online live video workshop for the Year 6 children as part of their secondary school transition events.

The workshop was run by Kooth, the online wellbeing community. Two councillors from Kooth spoke to the children about a range of subjects including the emotions involved in the move between primary and secondary school and offering strategies to help with stress and anxiety and to be able to build resilience when things get tough.

What a Week!

This week has seen an emotional return of two of our most popular summer events: the current families Open Evening on Tuesday evening and yesterday, our Sports Day.

The Open Evening saw the opportunity to wander around the school seeing all of the learning from each of the yeargroups, either by going in to the classrooms, or appreciating the corridor and hall displays.

Popping in to both the children's current classroom and next year's for a look round at the learning, artwork and for an informal chat with both class teachers would have been the highlight for many. We were also very pleased to be able to showcase some of the new sports and wellbeing activities that happen around school each day, out on the playground with the Sports Crew, supervised by Mrs Ball.

We are very grateful for the lovely feedback offered on the night, the first all school event in the school building since the beginning of the pandemic - it was great to see you all!

Then, we were delighted to welcome hundreds of you in to school yesterday for Sports Day. Firstly in the morning with events for the EYFS Classes, Key Stage 1 and Year 3 who took part in a carousel of activities, earning points as they went. The activities included Hurdles, Egg and Spoon, Bean Bag Throws, an Obstacle Course, Javelin, Space Hopper Bounces, Football Dribble and the Shuttle Run. They then all competed in a series of sprints over 50m or 100m with relays for Year 3 as well. All of the points earned in the activities and races counted towards personal challenges and the big prize : champion class of the yeargroup. It was a similar competition for the Year 4,5 and 6 classes in the afternoon event, only they had a hockey dribble replacing the football. All of the sprints were over 100m and each yeargroup also had boys and girls relays.

The event was considered a huge success and great thanks must go to everyone who was able to come and support throughout the day - there were hundreds of you and we are very grateful for you giving up your time to cheer on the children in all of their endeavours.

Over a school year, we are due to be open for 190 days which equates to 380 sessions with registration in the morning at 08:50 and after lunch in the afternoon.

It is important that the children are at school on time every day to prevent disruption and upset to their day and for the rest of their class.

Procedure if your child is unwell

If your child is not well and not able to come to school then we ask that parents telephone the school office on 01732 350354 **everyday** of their child's absence. With the current COVID pandemic, please follow government guidelines, but please still let us know if your child will be absent from school. If they are having to self-isolate but are well, then they will need to be taking part in home learning.
