Yesterday we were honoured as a school to be part of the Queen's Commonwealth Baton Relay event, hosted by Tonbridge Borough Council on the Castle Lawn, attended by children and adults from other local schools and organisations too. The atmosphere was electric as we all welcomed the baton onto the stage where it was eagerly received and paraded by local Olympic hero Dame Kelly Holmes. Entertainment for all present included a performance by our own Year 3 Signing Choir who stole the show, with their rendition of 'This is me' from The Greatest Showman; there wasn't a dry eye amongst us! Well done and huge congratulations to all of the children for their outstanding behaviour and participation throughout the whole event and to all the staff for the part that you played too. An incredibly proud moment!

Yesterday was also transition day across the school with all of the children enjoying spending time in their new classes, meeting their new teachers and adults. There was a lovely hum of activity across the school as everyone settled into their new surroundings with pupils and staff enjoying getting to know each other and their new routines in preparation for September. Visit to Warner Bros. Studios, London

On Wednesday, Pegasus and Hippogriff Classes took part in a school trip that they will remember for a long, long time.


The children in Year 3 all made the trip around the M25 to the Warner Bros. Studio to take part in workshops and tour around the Harry Potter World.

All of the teachers who accompanied the children were full of praise for their behaviour both on the long trip to the venue and whilst they were there. They were all a credit to themselves, their families and of course Slade Primary School.

Firstly, the 60 wizards went into the VIP area 'backstage' to participate in a workshop lesson on screenplays and play scripts, which linked in perfectly with their recent classroom learning. They were tasked with creating a story based on some very special objects: actual props used in the Harry Potter movies! To protect the items, the children had to sanitize their hands and then wear white cotton gloves whilst handling the priceless items.



The first object they had to concentrate on was to inspire them to think about the character of their story, then the problem that would make up the storyline, with the third aimed at inspiring the children's thoughts about the resolution of the problem; the ending of the story.





One final highlight for children and adults alike - the 'Green Screen' experience. They were taught how the green screen works and also had the opportunity to perform in front of it, special action pictures of them flying on a broom! The Baton Run Comes to Tonbridge

The whole school made the short hop to the Castle Lawn on Thursday morning to help celebrate the passing through of the Queen's Baton Relay – an epic journey across the Commonwealth, visiting all 72 nations and territories.

The Relay began on 7 October 2021, with Her Majesty The Queen placing her Message to the Commonwealth into the Baton. The Baton is now on its 294-day long journey to every corner of the Commonwealth including on Thursday, Tonbridge High Street and Castle.

This collective journey will ignite hope, solidarity and collaboration, as it connects communities embraces unique cultures and shares inspirational stories. The journey ends with the start of the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham later this month.

After the public display through the High Street, local school children were invited to a private event at the castle where there was entertainment and exercise before the main part of the show; the entry of the baton.



The children were treated to a physical warm up, flag waving and music before greeting local dignitaries who included The Deputy Lieutenant of Kent, The Mayor of Tonbridge and Malling Cllr Mrs Sue Bell, Leader of the Council Matt Boughton and his colleague Des Keers (Cabinet Member for Community Services) as well as Chair of Visit Kent, Deidre Wells and local Member of Parliament, Tom Tugendhat MP, who has today announced he will be standing for election to lead the Conservative Party to replace the current Prime Minister.



The star of the show, Dame Kelly Holmes, was then introduced to the crowd. Kelly entertained them and asked them how much they enjoyed different sports that are competed for in the Commonwealth Games. After this, the stage was handed over to groups of school children to do their own acts, this included a choir from Bishop Chavasse School and a mathematical song from girls at Fosse Bank School. The undoubted top act was of course, the Slade Signing Choir.

They performed brilliantly in front of all of the pupils of our school as well as large groups from Hildenborough Primary School, Trottiscliffe Primary School, Royal Rise School, Hillview School for Girls and Weald of Kent Grammar School as well as their fellow performers. Mrs Martin and Miss Havering were incredibly proud of the Signing Choir, who went on to have their picture with Kelly Holmes and continued to make the stage their own at today's Hillview Primary Festival of Arts which also included performances from Mrs Stephen's Choir and Dance from Mrs Ball's DanceFit and the Tuesday afternoon DanceMode group.



The morning finished with a further chance to shake the limbs with a dance for all of the watching children and adults. It was a fantastic morning and we are very grateful to Tonbridge and Malling Council for inviting us, especially as it gave the children at Slade the opportunity to share the experience with the whole school and the local community.

Procedure if your child is unwell
