Dear Parents and Carers,

The first week of October has been another busy one here in school!

Earlier this week I enjoyed spending time with Pixie and Elf Classes, supporting them with their learning in class. Firstly, we were learning to use adjectives in our sentences during our Writing lesson before using the Numicon to help us partition our numbers in Maths with all of the children working incredibly hard throughout both lessons! It was great to see how quickly the children have transitioned and settled into their new year group and the progress that they have already made this term with their learning. Thank you for making me so welcome Pixie and Elves! Across the coming weeks Miss Garrett and I will be spending time in all of the classes working alongside the children and supporting them in lessons. Watch this space for more updates!

As shared last week, you too will have an opportunity to drop in to your child's class during the first week of Term 2 to spend time with your child in their classroom and look at their books with them. I was informed earlier this week that Susie Martin, Teaching Assistant for the Deaf here at Slade, was recently nominated for an award in this year's Kent Deaf Children's Society (KDCS) Awards for Recognition & Achievement. I am thrilled to announce that from a strong field Susie has been selected by the panel of trustees as winner for the 'Outstanding Contribution to the Deaf Community' this year! Huge congratulations to Susie on this fantastic achievement in recognition of all that she does to support the deaf community not just here in Slade but outside of school too, particularly with her work with her Signing Choirs. Well done and thank you Susie; we are all very proud of you!

Also this week we have seen the removal of the scaffolding from Gruffalo Classroom and the reappearance of the classroom building! I have been informed by KCC and the building contractors that the roofing work currently underway on the classroom is still on track to be completed to schedule for the start of Term 2, at the end of October. We now have a new roof on the building but are awaiting on a new ceiling to be installed and the remaining interior works to be completed. Thank you to all children, staff and parents for your ongoing patience and understanding as we continue to navigate our way through this building project. Fingers crossed that it's not for too much longer now!

A huge thank you to the PTA and all the parent volunteers who have been busily organizing the long awaited return of the Key Stage 2 school disco this evening. There is much excitement and anticipation amongst the children who are very much looking forward to getting their dancing shoes on! Huge thanks too to the staff team who are delaying the start to their weekend to be here this evening too. I'm looking forward to seeing you all on the dance floor later!

It is important that the children are at school on time every day to prevent disruption and upset to their day and for the rest of their class.


Punctuality Pup is awarded to the class with the best punctuality each week.
