

Year 6 Bikeability

Early Years Application to Primary School in 2023

It was fantastic to welcome nearly 70 families to Slade on Wednesday morning. The families all have preschool aged children who are considering their choice of primary school; starting Early Years Year R in September 2023.

We hope everyone who came along had a good time and found the visit useful. Remember, we are here throughout the process to help where you need advice.

We will be holding a further, completely fully booked event next week.

If you are a parent of a child born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019, you need to apply for a place at primary school. You must do so via the Kent County Council online portal at https://www.kent.gov.uk/education-and-children/ schools/school-places/primary-school-places anytime up to midnight on Monday 16 January 2023.

Sibling Applications

Kent County Council have asked us to remind all parents who have a child starting school in September 2023 that they need to make an application even if they already have an older sibling in the chosen school. This applies to all parents of children currently in Year R-5. Please make sure you follow the same process, using the form in the attachment above.

Children currently in Year 6 do not count as a sibling link as they will not be attending primary school in September.

If you have, or are planning to make, a sibling link application to Slade could you please let us know by email to admissions@slade.kent.sch.uk - this assists us with the checking and validating process later on in the year.

It's important to find out more about the schools you are interested in before you decide to name them on the application form.

A simple, fast, convenient process which opens Friday 4 November 2022 and closes at midnight on Monday 16 January 2023.

You will first need to set up an online account. The applicant is you, the parent/carer; you will then need to add your child's details before starting an application. You will receive a confirmation email that your application has been correctly submitted.

You can log back in at any time to view the information submitted.

Receiving your offer

You must accept or decline the school place you have been offered by Monday 1 May 2023.

A link to a guide with information you will need to provide the school with will be in your offer email. If it has not been possible to offer your child a place in your preferred school, you have the right to appeal. You can also add their name to the school's waiting list.

Moving house during the application window will likely complicate your application and we therefore advise you to pay special attention to key dates in the admissions process. KCC has no discretionary authority to vary the process for parents who cannot complete address moves in time to make use of them for admissions purposes. They were up against 12 teams from 10 other schools in the West Kent region and remained undefeated all night in the eight minute matches at the competition at Leigh Academy (formerly Hayesbrook School.)

They played five group games (versus St John's Tunbridge Wells, St James, Tunbridge Wells, Claremont, St Margaret Clitherow and Hildenborough Primary School) before taking on and beating Claremont A Team in the Semi Final. The semi final went to extra time, where our team won with a 'Golden Basket' shot.

This took us to the final, where we came up against the ever competitive St Matthew's of Tunbridge Wells. Our teamwork and using the team spirit our girls had alongside Mrs Ball and Mrs Elliott on the sidelines took us to a fantastic, if nail biting, 9:8 victory in normal time.

Emi travelled to Medway to compete in the Kent Table Tennis Tournament on Tuesday and was delighted to win the 'second division' or 'plate' tournament 2-1 in the final!

She ran away with the final set winning it 11-1. This tournament was open to those who lost their first-round match. Emi narrowly lost in the first-round to a girl who eventually came second in the main tournament. That match ended 2-1, with the final set being a closely fought 11-8 with some brilliant rallies.

The experience was great for her confidence., especially as it was a little intimidating initially. Other than Emi and one boy, all the children there were from four schools that had competed in the morning, so were already acclimatised to the setting, plus some who went to the venue as a Table Tennis club - they were getting some coaching from the organisers as Emi and her dad arrived!

Emi quickly introduced herself and challenged some boys and girls to some friendly matches, winning a few and doing very well against the girls champion. So, it was a great experience for her with Emi playing around 5-6 matches.

The Kent Deaf Children's Society Awards Dinner

Everyone at Slade could not be more delighted for and proud of Susie Martin, our multi award winning Teaching Assistant who works across Slade with our Hearing Impaired children out of Titans Class.

Susie was the winner at last weekend's Kent Deaf Children's Society awards dinner at Canterbury Cathedral Lodge. The ceremony is held every year and recognises people in the deaf community young and old who have overcome difficulties and for people like Susie who have made an outstanding contribution to the deaf community. There was the award ceremony then a dinner and disco for all the attendees.

Susie won the Outstanding Contribution to the Deaf Community award for all that she does in school to support the deaf children and for setting up the Children's Signing Choir and for the performances they do inside and outside school as well as for promoting sign language in the wider community by setting up her mixed sign language choir which meet on a Wednesday night at Borough Green. She was nominated by parent Kelly Pilcher, who we thank for thinking of Susie for the award and for going through the nomination process.

Susie was joined at the event by teaching staff at Slade and the children and families of some our Titans Hearing Impaired Provision members themselves.







Susie told us, 'I was extremely grateful to be nominated for the award for Outstanding Contribution to the Deaf Community and I was even more thrilled to actually win the award!

It was a truly wonderful evening and I felt honoured to be part of it. KDCS is an incredible charity and they do such fantastic work for children and their families within the Deaf Community.

It was wonderful to see so many amazing people including many children, receive their awards. I felt humbled to be part of this award ceremony.

I absolutely love my role working in the Hearing Impaired resource at Slade and I always encourage wherever possible to teach as many of the students and staff to use BSL and sign within the school.

This has fortunately spilled out to the wider community where I have set up my own Award winning Signing Choir in my local village which I am extremely proud of having won an award at the National Signing Choir Competition in London this year!!

Also, of course, the Signing Choir here at Slade School. This has given the hearing children along with the deaf children the opportunity to learn BSL in a fun way through learning to sign the songs.

I feel blessed that my Signing Choirs outside and inside School have been received so well.

I can't thank the parents enough who nominated me. It means so much!'


