By this time next Friday, we will have been able to report on a busy day across the school as we host the full return of 'Christmas Day at Slade'.


To help with a few questions that we have been asked all of this week:



Invicta Maths



Great Result for our Maths Challengers

On Wednesday, Invicta Grammar School in Maidstone hosted their Primary School Maths Challenge - an annual event for children at local primary schools to stretch their maths knowledge in the fun environment that competition can bring.


Mr Duffin and Mrs Buckland travelled with our team to the County Town and were immensely proud of them as Slade came a brilliant second place in the highly competitive, challenging tournament. This was a particularly fantastic result as the only team to finish above them were St Andrew's - a co-educational independent school in Rochester.

Our team of Jing-Yi, Iris, Ethan and Tapasya thoroughly deserved their special mention in today's Celebration Assembly. Jing-Yi told us all about the day, 'We went to Invicta Grammar School for an amazing Maths Challenge - we worked as a team to answer the questions. First, we had the relay where we worked as two teams of two to answer 15 questions each. After lunch, we worked as a whole group for 15 questions and finally the Speed Round where we had 20 minutes for 20 questions. Team work and intelligence payed off as we came second!'





The maths teacher at Invicta who oversaw the challenge commented to Mr Duffin how impressed he was in the strategies that Slade used to work out their answers, especially their use of trial and error answers and using their whiteboards to maximum effect.



Our thanks to everyone at Invicta Grammar School for their hospitality all day on Wednesday and to the parents who took the children to Maidstone, enabling them to have the successful day that they enjoyed.

Warm Up (just to get your brains working - these are their words, not ours!)

What is the value of the third cube added to the fifth square number?

• 2017 is a prime number, when is the next year that is prime?

Group Round

• The local hotel has 200 rooms. The rooms are numbered in ascending order starting with the number 1. However, the owners are a superstitious lot and none of the rooms have a number which is a multiple of 13 or has the sum of the digits of the room number equal to 13.

These rooms are given names instead of numbers. How many rooms have names instead of numbers?

Speed Round

- The product of three consecutive whole numbers is 990. What is the sum of the three numbers?
- It is 175 miles from Exeter to London by train. The train does the journey at an average speed of 60 miles per hour. How long does this journey take? Give the answer in hours and minutes.
- In a single day, 5% of my time is spent reading, 30% is spent sleeping and 20% is spent at school. I divide the remainder of my time equally between spending time with the family, spending time with friends and playing sports. How many minutes do I spend playing sports?

It is important that the children are at school on time every day to prevent disruption and upset to their day and for the rest of their class.


Punctuality Pup is awarded to the class with the best punctuality each week.
