Around School




Christmas Day at Slade

The members were treated to whole group songs, duets and solos; they were particularly impressed with the children's singing, signing and the way they conducted themselves both when on stage and after their performance, when they sat respectfully whilst there was a quiz on the Far East in progress.

The Judd School Music Festival

On Thursday afternoon and evening, the whole of Year 5 walked to The Judd School for a special musical concert that involved ourselves alongside pupils from Sussex Road and Longmead Schools. We were very lucky to have spoken to Olivia in Dragon Class who took us through their day:

'We have been taught by a music teacher from The Judd School all term, she is called Miss Rachel Riley. Miss Riley works with another teacher, Miss Megan Pitts, who went to Sussex Road and Longmead to help their children learn the same songs. We walked over to Judd School and rehearsed in the afternoon all of the songs that we had learnt this year - it was really fun because we had been learning one verse, the other schools also had a verse and their were chorus parts that we all sang together. It was the first time we had heard the songs all the way through and they sounded fantastic!'

The children sung five songs: We Need a Little Christmas, Power in the Music, Believe, Sparkle and Shine and Nazareth. Maths Challenge: How did you do?

Last week in our report on the Invicta Maths Challenge, we asked you to have a go at home. Thankyou to everyone who had a go, including those who emailed their answers in.

So are you a budding maths superstar to rival Jing-Yi, Iris, Ethan and Tapasya? Find out below:

Warm Up (just to get your brains working - these are their words, not ours!)

• What is the value of the third cube added to the fifth square number?

$$3^3 + 5^2 = (3 \times 3 \times 3) + (5 \times 5) = 27 + 25 = 52$$

2017 is a prime number, when is the next year that is prime?

Group Round

• The local hotel has 200 rooms. The rooms are numbered in ascending order starting with the number 1. However, the owners are a superstitious lot and none of the rooms have a number which is a multiple of 13 or has the sum of the digits of the room number equal to 13. These rooms are given names instead of numbers. How many rooms have names instead of numbers?

We spoke to Malvina just as she returned from the swimming pool with her Sphinx Class who had just finished their last school swimming lesson of the term.

She was very happy to share the story of her medal haul:


'I have been swimming for over two years and I started taking swimming lessons at Tonbridge Pool before joining their club. It is my favourite sport and love swimming a lot. Both my brothers also swim (Malvina said they were as good, but she was being very modest about her own success!) I took part in the 50 metres races in the recent Tonbridge Club gala in all of the main stokes (Front, back and breast stroke.) I was incredibly happy to win the bronze stroke for my breaststroke and silver medal for my front crawl.'

We also managed a quick word about what the children are asked to do when they go to the pool with school: 'Today, we practiced our front crawl technique which will make us stronger swimmers before playing a game of sinkers - where we have to try and pick up a number of bricks from the bottom of the pool, it was a lot of fun for me and all of the class.'


