




Finally, for those of you planning ahead, term dates for the next academic year 2023-2024 are now available on the school website.

The children have been dragging them up the field, using them to plan and build dens and they have noticed that using the needles on the ground helps to dry up the mud and gives them an easier path to walk on.




It is great to be back in Forest School following the flooding before Christmas, and has been made possible with these kind donations.

KS1 Physical Literacy: The Angel Centre

On Wednesday we were pleased to make the walk down to the Angel Centre for the Key Stage 1 Physical Literacy Festival of Activities.

The children took part in a number of different sports that involved bowling, throwing, skipping as well as games using balloons and the parachute.

All of the children did incredibly well and they will all be presented with a medal from Mrs Ball to celebrate their effort and success.









In addition to the KS1 squad, we were honoured to be asked by the Tonbridge and West Kent Sports Partnership to help organise and supervise the event. This task was brilliantly carried out by 10 of our Year 5 and 6 Sports Leaders. They showed great maturity and enthusiasm in carrying out their tasks which involved looking after and helping out KS1 children from schools across the West Kent region.

KS2 Beginners Badminton

Also on Wednesday, Mrs Ball took a team of KS2 children to Hayesbrook Academy to try out the sport of Badminton. It was the first time that the children had been introduced to this sport and they all had a great time trying it out!

They took part in 10 activities, each one helping to improve their skills. They started by using a soft ball to hit using a badminton racquet, before using a shuttlecock. They balanced the shuttlecock and then learnt how to hit it using forehand and backhand stokes. Michael, one of the team, told us today that he had a great time and was so pleased that tried badminton: 'Thankyou Mrs Ball for taking me, I was very happy that I was able to hit the shuttlecock very far and high, I hit the soft ball right to the ceiling!'
