Parents and Carers Prevent Training

We are pleased to advertise our upcoming online safety event for parents.

The meeting, hosted by our local Prevent Education Officer, Sally Green who has recently held workshops in school with our Year 5 and 6 children, has also led training for staff and governors here at Slade and is pleased to be able to do the same of parents and carers as we all endeavour to keep ourselves and our children safe online.



Sally says, 'As a parent, it is important to be aware that individuals and groups with extremist views use the internet and social media to spread their ideas and opinions. Children spend a lot of time online, and this can make them more susceptible to extremism from all aspects. Extremist groups tap into young people's insecurities and sense of adventure. They often claim to offer answers and promise a sense of identity and friendship. It's important to remember that any child can be affected by extremism. This session aims to heighten awareness to the susceptibilities young children can face from radicalisation and extremism. The session will explore how radicalisation may present in children, and how parents can help to protect their children from this type of exploitation.'

The meeting will be held via Microsoft Teams so can be accessed anywhere on Tuesday 23 May between 09:30 and 10:30.

School Games Eco-Friendly Ambassador Training



Slade Primary School were proud and privileged to be chosen to represent Tonbridge at the first ever School Games Eco-Friendly Ambassador Training, held at the Polo Farm Sports Centre in Canterbury on Wednesday.



We have 11 ambassadors who made the journey to learn about how they can play their part (and help us all join in) to help to enhance the sustainability of schools across England.

The day was designed around activities and presentations designed to get the children thinking and acting on how to create a more eco friendly, sustainable school and wider community. To do this they had to learn how we have arrived at the point where this is such an urgent issue worldwide.




We were delighted to be joined by Violet, Charlotte and Winnie who spoke enthusiastically about the challenges that lay ahead:

'We started by finding out how the Industrial Revolution in the 18th and early 19th centuries. The industry obviously helped the people at the time as the country manufactured more, which grew the economy and saw lots of inventions which we still use today, but it also left the environment damaged from the smoke from factories continuing to harm us even now. However, it is not too late - we can all help improve things and our new Eco-Committee is determined to start that work.'

The girls described how they heard presentations from super channel swimmer Sarah and Road Safety officials before being tasked with creating an action plan with targets on how they can roll out an eco friendly approach across the school.

'We think that we can do a lot at Slade to encourage a more sustainable future. Firstly, we can make sure we recycle everything we can, rather than just throwing everything away and to landfill. We can also make sure that at all school events we use reusable cups and plates and not single use versions.



Personal targets are also important - eating less meat, being responsible with water use and choosing eco friendly packaging when buying products in shops and supermarkets being just some simple ways to make quick environmental wins in everyday life.

One of the favourite games they played at the event in Canterbury was 'Plogging'. Plogging keeps you fit and the environment clean by jogging around (anywhere - a school, the park, the local street) with a litter picker and see how much can be caught and then appropriately disposed of - everything that can be recycled to be done so correctly, or maybe used in an art or craft making session - a passion of Charlotte's.
