




Deaf Awareness Week

It goes without saying that Deaf Awareness Week has a special place in the hearts of all of the children and staff at Slade. We continue to be immensely proud of our Titans Hearing Impaired Provision and it is the children of Titans who have taken centre stage in this week's celebrations.

The children and deaf adults who learn and work at Slade produced a very moving and special video that was played out in Key Stage assemblies on Wednesday - the videos allowed members of our deaf community to describe their own story, the difficulties and the joy. There were more than a few wet eyes watching on!

In addition to general awareness, touched on in our special Meet the Team interview with Teaching Assistant Alex Taylor on pages 7 and 8 of today's newsletter, the classes across Slade each researched a deaf or hearing impaired person from history to present. These facts will form part of a display in school from next week, we will bring you pictures of this in our next newsletter. In the meantime, can you or your child name any of these famous people, who will be featuring on the display and have formed part of this week's research and learning. Each class had one person to write about.



The Deaf Mosaic

Our regular feature which is usually on the back page of the newsletter and looks at sign language in the community, takes in a very special exhibition this week.

The Deaf Mosaic photographs can be found in and around the Kings Cross and St Pancras area of London. It is a celebration of the 90,000+ users of BSL as their preferred or first language.

The Deaf Mosaic is a 10 year project by Stephen liffe, who has photographed members of the deaf community from all walks of life. Stephen describes the project as his, 'most personal project, (having grown) up the only deaf kid in a mainstream school I had no adult deaf role model for what I could achieve in life. It wasn't until my 20s that I stumbled across the deaf community.' He goes on to say, 'There are so many ways to create access for deaf people - from sign language interpreters to technical aids, from TV and video captions to inclusive classrooms and workplaces.'

At Slade we are pleased and proud of the very little things we do for our own deaf community and for the future pupils

of our Titans Provision.

Meet The Team



Alex Taylor: Titans Teaching Assistant

Alex is the inspiration behind many of our special initiatives involving the wonderful children and adults in Slade's Hearing Impaired Provision, known as Titans in school. It is fitting therefore, that we caught up with Alex this week as the Deaf Community across the country celebrate Deaf Awareness Week.

Alex is not hearing impaired, but has fully immersed herself within the deaf community, the inspiration to do so came from an unlikely source:

It all started with a television advert many years ago, I can't even remember what product they were selling, but it was set in an old fashioned town library with signs everywhere telling people to be quiet - everyone in the scene looked miserable, then the shot scanned to a couple who were signing away to each other, smiling and laughing. It made me laugh out loud at home watching and from that moment I decided, I want to do that!

When did you start to learn to sign with qualifications?

I passed my Level 1 BSL examination in 2015 and two years later achieved my Level 2. By this time the passion behind this language grew and I pushed myself to continue to learn and use BSL as much as possible - this continued through the pandemic when I passed the Level 3 exam in 2021. I am so proud of my colleague, Susie Martin, who is qualified at Level 6, one short of Interpreter qualification.

What opportunities are opened up with these qualifications?

Well, at Level 3, you would be able to work in schools and for public bodies such as the police - to be an interpreter though opens up lots of doors such as being able to sign to assist hearing impaired people with details of medical care including in emergency situations in hospital and to be able to translate the proceedings of a Court case to a witness, victim or defendant. Interpreters earn upwards of £370 a day for this kind of work, so are in demand!

This week has been a big one for the Deaf Community hasn't it?

Oh yes! The 28th of April will always be seen as a very special day, as this is the anniversary of when BSL became a legally recognised language in statute in the UK following many years of campaigning. It remains amazing that this was only completed in 2022 - but well done again to everyone who made it happen.

This week is Deaf Awareness Week, which is different, as this concentrates more on those who do not use sign language, either from the hearing community, or those deaf people who do not use sign. The focus is very much on encouraging good, positive communication towards deaf people using clear facial expressions and speaking with your face and mouth directed towards the deaf person you are talking to, or even being prepared to write some details down. It is easy to do, but vital to prevent yourself from a more patronising way of trying to communicate, such as just speaking louder and slower! We have looked at the good and not so good ways of doing this with class groups across school as part of our awareness sessions.

It is important to recognise sign language like any additional language such as French or German isn't it?

Absolutely. We have families at Slade for who BSL is a first language, some where it is an additional language used by a or a few members, and some in Titan's who do not use it at all at home - in any case, just like learning French or German, you have to keep using it to not lose the ability and to keep improving. Like all modern languages, BSL is also constantly evolving; two examples I can think of immediately is that there is of course a sign now for 'Covid' and even the way that you sign the word 'Parents' which allows for the varied make up of family units and how to best represent these with respect.

Alex Taylor: Titans Teaching Assistant



On a more personal note Alex, did you grow up with any deaf influences from school?

No, not at all. I attended Michael Hall School in Tunbridge Wells. That was great and I had a good time there. I do remember being introduced to a book about Helen Keller who lost both her sight and hearing after an illness which was important. It gave me the first taste of how one can or should communicate with someone who cannot just see or hear what is going on, including the fascinating methods used to be able to describe colour to a blind person.



You have family connections here at Slade as well though:

I do! My husband attended Slade, and my two children Martha and Wyatt both came here. They had a fantastic time, and of course, I followed them all by getting a job here. Firstly, as a volunteer, then as 1:1 Teaching Assistant which I enjoyed, but the chance to work with Jayne (Laker) and the team in the Hearing Impaired Provision when an opportunity arose was too big a chance to turn down. I was fortunate to get the job in what we now know as Titans when we had three hearing impaired children start in the Early Years Foundation Stage - these children are now in Year6!

We hear that your work at Slade is being used as an inspiration closer to home as well?

I am very proud of my daughter Martha, who is now in her first year of GCSE studies. Martha has always been interested in learning to sign and indeed in everything that the deaf community have to offer. She has an ambition of reaching interpreter level of BSL - and has made a super start having been having lessons online since the pandemic, achieving Level 1 BSL and will be starting her Level 2 course in September. She was actively campaigning for the legal status of BSL and celebrated with everyone who was as delighted as we were on 28 April last year! She has also introduced a 'Sign of the Day' at her secondary school to introduce fellow hearing students to the rich and useful language.

Thankyou to Alex for taking time out of the preparations that the staff in Titans were doing at the time we spoke to her on Tuesday as they readied themselves for today's Coronation celebrations, especially Susie Martin's video of the signed version of the National Anthem, learnt and copied by the children across the school today! Also, many best wishes and good luck to Martha in her BSL learning.

It is important that the children are at school on time every day to prevent disruption and upset to their day and for the rest of their class.


Punctuality Pup is awarded to the class with the best punctuality each week.


