

Dear Parents and Carers,

Well done and huge congratulations to all of our Year 6 pupils who this week have completed their end of Key Stage 2 SATs tests. All of the children who sat the tests demonstrated a positive 'can do' attitude throughout the week and should be very proud of themselves and their achievements; we are all immensely proud of each and every one of you! Thank you to everyone involved in the planning and running of this week which enabled it to go as smoothly as possible for the children involved and to the remainder of the school for your patience and understanding during the week too. A real team effort; thank you.

A separate communication has been sent to parents of children in Year 2 to provide an update regarding their end of Key Stage 1 statutory assessments which will be taking place in school next week. The children will be assessed in Reading and Maths with tests taking place in smaller groups during the morning sessions and administered by the children's class teachers and support staff. Do contact your child's class teacher in the first instance should you have any queries regarding the Key Stage 1 SATs arrangements or to discuss any concerns that you may have.

Please look out for this term's Maths newsletter which will also be dropping into your inboxes today. This month's edition is once again jam packed with maths-based activities for you to enjoy as a family at home and is a great opportunity for you to find out more about ways in which you can support your child with their maths learning too. Do take a look to find out which family won last month's maths at home competition and some of the other fabulous photos of our mathematicians at Slade! Thank you Mr. Duffin for another great edition!

At this time of year we start planning ahead for September, thinking about classroom organisation and staffing for the start of Term 1. We recognise that this time of change can sometimes be an anxious time for some children and parents. Due to the lateness of the resignation date for class teachers (31st May) and the implications of this I am not at present able to share any information with you. We will however endeavor to inform you of any changes as early as possible in Term 6, thus allowing time for a smooth transition for all involved. Please be assured as soon as that information is available you will all be the first to know!

Also, when thinking of planning ahead, a couple of dates for your diaries that you may have missed. Firstly, a reminder for Year 5 parents that there is an information evening about the Kent Test and Secondary School application process planned for Wednesday 17 May at 7pm in the school hall. This is open to all parents of pupils in Year 5 to explain the secondary transfer process and answer any queries that you may have. Entrance to the school site will be from the main playground entrance; we look forward to seeing you there.

In addition, a reminder to all parents of our upcoming online safety event which will be held via Microsoft Teams on Tuesday 23 May between 09:30 and 10:30. The meeting, hosted by our local Prevent Education Officer Sally Green, aims to provide support, guidance and tips for parents on how to best keep ourselves and our children safe online. Having previously attended some of Sally's training I can thoroughly recommend this session if you are able to attend.

Kent County Council's (KCC) Fostering Service, Kent Fostering, is urgently calling for residents to consider fostering in the midst of a national foster carer recruitment and retention "state of emergency".

Nationally, 63,000 new foster families need to be recruited over the next five years to replace those leaving the system, however based on the current trend fewer than 40,000 are expected to join the fostering community.

Many vulnerable children and young people in Kent urgently need safe and loving homes in their local communities so that they can stay near their schools and friendship groups and not miss out on the vital care and support they need.

Matching the growing number of children in the council's care with the right foster family is becoming more difficult as numbers increase alongside a rapid decline in the number of residents becoming foster carers.

This could mean that there will not be enough suitable homes in the very near future and Kent's vulnerable children and young people could miss out on the support they need to give them the best opportunities and outcomes in life.

The Kent Fostering team are always available to support our foster carers every step of the way from initial expressions of interest onwards.


