To ensure that we send these to the correct schools or academies, can parents of children in Year 6 who are now going to a different school than first allocated by Kent County Council on National Offer Day in March let us know where you have now got an accepted and confirmed place. This can be because of a successful appeal, reallocation from waiting list or a decision to enter the private sector.

Your assistance with this is much appreciated and will ensure that your personal information and data is not lost by being sent to the incorrect destination.

Why is it important to attend school every day?

- ▶ To ensure you have an education
- ▶ To ensure you don't miss any of the learning
- ► To learn about lots of different subjects
- ▶ To make friends and learn how to play together
- ► To develop your skills
- ▶ To prepare you for when you are an adult
- ► To keep you safe

Why is it important to arrive on time every day?

- ▶ To help you have a calm start to the day and be ready to start your learning
- ▶ To ensure you don't miss any of your learning
- ► To have time with your friends
- ▶ To have time to talk to your teachers if you have any news to share/worries

What are the reasons for missing school?

- ▶ Feeling unwell Do you think you are well enough to come into school and try and learn? Why not try to come in if your teachers are worried about you they can always call home. This way at least you would get 1 attendance mark for the day!
- ▶ Doctors, Dentists or Hospital Appointments where possible your parents/carers should try and make appointments after school, at the weekends, or during the holidays.
