## Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back everyone! I hope that you all had an enjoyable half term break. Term 6 has got off to a flying start with lots of fabulous learning taking place across the school.

A huge well done and congratulations to all of our Year 4 pupils in Phoenix and Sphinx classes who this week have completed their statutory Multiplication Tables Check, the purpose of which is to determine whether the children can recall their times tables fluently. All pupils who took the check should be very proud of themselves and their achievements; your Times Tables Rockstar practice has really paid off so well done to each and every one of you! Next week it is the turn of our Year 1 children who will undertake their statutory Phonics Screening Check; further information regarding the screening has been sent out in a separate communication to Year 1 parents earlier today but do get in touch with your child's class teacher should you have any queries about this.

On Tuesday we welcomed Zurina Slade (no relation!) and Sue Holder, both from the Local Authority, into school to carry out a monitoring visit of provision in our Specialist Resource Provision, Titans Class. Both were full of praise with all that they saw when observing lessons and interventions and from what they heard when talking to key members of staff and the children too. Although the focus of the visit was in Titans both were extremely complementary on the inclusive ethos that was evident across the school for all of our children, especially those with additional needs. A huge well done and thank you to all in the Titans Team who were involved in the visit and to the wider Inclusion Team too for the provision that you provide on a daily basis.

Wednesday saw the welcome return of our 'Who am I?' day, a celebration of all that makes us special and unique. It was so lovely to see all the children and staff represent themselves by the clothes that they were wearing and the objects that they shared. There was a real buzz across the school during the afternoon as all the children learnt of each other's cultures, religions and heritages; do read on into the newsletter to find out more and see some photos capturing this special afternoon. Do also look out for this term's Year group newsletters which will all be dropping into your inboxes on Monday; these are a great opportunity for you to find out more of what your child will be learning throughout this term and offer ways in which you can support your child too. Next week sees the return of the Year 1 Phonics Screening. The children in Pixie and Elf Classes will be taking the verbal assessment individually 1:1 with a member of staff they already know in a quiet part of the school to show off the phonics knowledge they have learnt since starting school. They will read a number of words (some real, some made up, but also phonically decodable) which show that they are able to break down the different sounds that make up the words they read and use everyday.

## Term Time Holidays

With the sun finally making an appearance we all begin to think ahead to our summer holidays. This is a polite reminder that parents and carers should plan their holidays around school breaks and avoid seeking permission from schools to take their children out of school during term time unless it is absolutely unavoidable.



From September 2013 the Department for Education has amended the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations 2006 removing the Head Teacher's ability to authorise leave of absence for a family holiday. Requests for holidays in term-time will not be authorised as the Regulations only allow the Headteacher to authorise absence (leave) in "exceptional circumstances".

The School's Attendance Policy confirms that:

- Agreement to each request is at Head teacher's discretion, acting on behalf of the Governing Body
- each case will be judged on its merits
- The Head teacher's decision is final
- Leave cannot be authorised retrospectively

Penalty Notices are issued to each parent of each child and the amount of the penalty will be £120 to be paid within 28 days, reduced to £60 if paid within 21 days. Failure to pay the penalty in full at the end of the 28 day period may result in prosecution by the Attendance Service.

Term 6 is full of exciting activities which run alongside the children's continued learning in addition to the transitional activities which are planned to support your child with the changes as they move from the end of this academic year and into the exciting next one. Every day counts and we do not want the children to miss any moment of this special summer term!

On Time Otter is still worried about children arriving late for school, or taking time out of school for routine medical appointments such as six monthly dental check ups or annual optician appointments.

Otter says, 'The school gates open at 08:40 and close at 08:50. If you find getting to school on time a bit tricky, just ask your parents to wake you up five minutes early - it is lovely getting up in the summer time when the sun is already out - you never know, if you get up earlier there may be time to play before school!

## Stepping Up To Secondary



Everyone at Slade appreciated that the step up to Secondary School can be a very exciting time for families, however we also appreciate that it can be stressful on both yourself and/or your child.

Kent Adult Education, along with our own Family Liaison team will be in school on Wednesday 21 June at 09.15 – 11.15 to hold a workshop for parents who have any worries, or know that their child may have concerns that they would like to either share, or hear ways to help. The team will be on hand to answer questions as well.

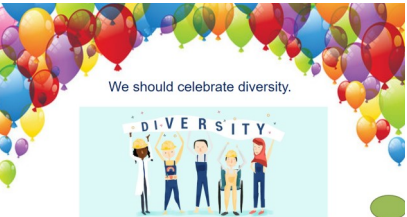
Olivia was wearing a lovely dress from Jakarta, capital city of her mother's home country of Indonesia.

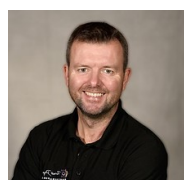

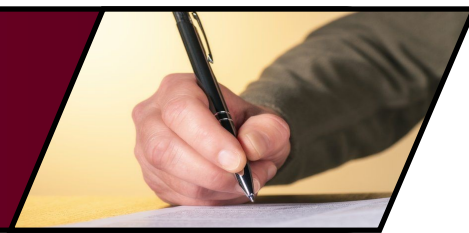
