FOCUS ON YEAR 4

Indian and Diwali Workshop

On Monday, the children in Year 4 Phoenix and Sphinx Classes were treated to a practical learning day which supported their current subjects in different curriculum areas.

They were joined by Joanna Hawkins from the Education Group based in Beckenham, who held a workshop looking at Indian culture, dance and beliefs including Diwali, which will be celebrated this Sunday by Hindus and Sikhs across the globe.

The morning sessions were taken with learning and performing Indian dances to traditional music, including some used in Bollywood movies!

The children found out all about Mudras. One of the most striking features of any Indian dance, Mudras are a set of different hand gestures which when performed together, tell a story and overall the dance paints the picture without the need for spoken narrative.

As part of their performance, the children were also taught of the importance and significance of neck, head and foot movements as well as facial expressions and costume.



In the afternoon, attention was turned to the holy festival of lights known as Diwali. Joanna spoke about the Diya - which is a lamp used during this special time for Hindu and Sikh households to symbolise prosperity for the forthcoming year. The word Diya means 'lamp' in Sanskrit.

Diwali marks the beginning of the New Year for Hindus, and is about the return of deities Rama and Sita after 14 years of exile.

The festival is known as Bandi Chhor Divas for Sikhs, celebrating the release of the sixth guru Hargobind Singh from prison in 1619.

The children then created their own beautiful designs on their own Diya, which will be able to be brought home later in the school year. The day was complete with learning about Diwali and how those people celebrating will visit friends and family, with sweets, gifts and good wishes being exchanged.

Some of the festive dishes enjoyed include puri (fried bread), paneer and gulab jamun - with celebrations for many being rounded off in style by lighting fireworks.

It will be worth remembering this weekend when you hear and see fireworks in the sky that it is not just the Gunpowder Plot that is being celebrated!

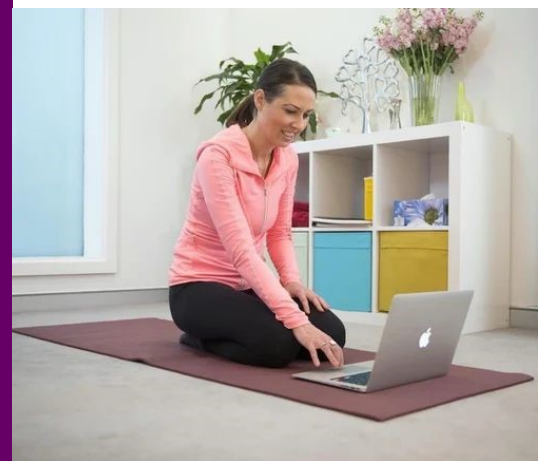

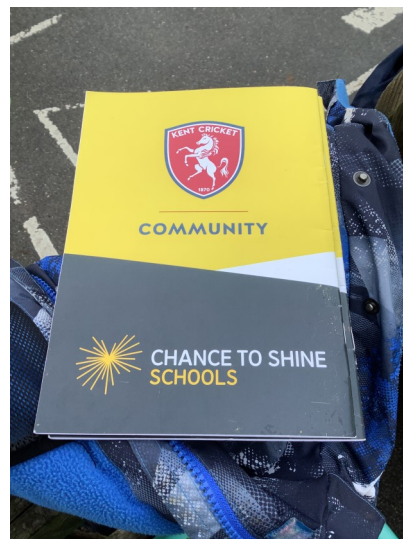
Kent Cricket Leaders

Ongoing Roadworks: Punctuality at School

Everyone will by now be aware that Tonbridge is currently suffering traffic delays caused by multiple roadworks, road closures and traffic diversions.

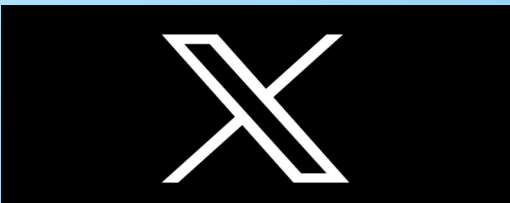
