### **Magical Musical News**

We have lots of wonderful musically related stories around Slade at present. In addition to the children's own and curriculum lessons and successes (thinking of our cover story a couple of weeks back featuring Arthur at the Maidstone Music Festival) we are pleased to include in today's issue, details of the lovely Christmas performances that our choirs have been taking part in this week, see page 5 for the full story.

We are also delighted to share news of our latest musical acquisition - our new electric piano - funded by a grant from Universal Music UK Sound Foundation.

Music lead at Slade, Steph Stephens said, 'We would like to thank the Universal Music UK Sound Foundation for the grant that allowed us to purchase a new electric piano. The piano has already been put to use in our choir sessions, allowing teachers to support the children with learning different parts to songs. It will also be used for pupils learning to play and within performances throughout the year. The children and staff are very impressed with the quality of sound and are excited to put it to use as much as possible.'

In securing the grant, School Business Manager Jill Westwood said, 'Schools have weathered consistent financial challenges throughout the ABC period (Austerity, Brexit, Covid-19), and still face constant financial challenges. Whilst searching for funding opportunities, we came across The Universal Music UK Sound Foundation. This Foundation supports the Instrument and Equipment Awards, which aim to improve access to music through the purchase or upgrade of musical instruments and equipment. Since starting in 2012, they have supported hundreds of organisations. The Foundation provided Slade Primary with a £750 grant towards the purchase of a new digital piano which has provided a fantastic opportunity for both our pupils and teachers of music to improve their musical interests and abilities.'

### **Tree Plea from Forest School**

If you have a real Christmas Tree at home and are already thinking about how to dispose of it responsibly in January, then we have the perfect plan.

Tina Hall, our Forest School Teacher would like to offer a free and easy recycling service - by donating them to Slade's Forest School.

The trees are excellent at soaking up winter mud and ground water and also act as a good grip for the children in the slippery parts of the wooded area - the children also like to practice with tools to cut the trees up, they make dens out of them and the trees, intriguingly, are also perfect for making wood cookies!














### **The Medway Tales**


The book's blub tells us about what to expect from these lovely and thoughtful stories:




# Looking ahead to our next fundraiser ....Bag2School

What better way to start a new year than with a clear out!! On Tuesday 30 January we have arranged a collection with Bag2School to raise funds for our school....we bring in our good quality, unwanted items, and they will pay us based on the total weight.

Bag2School is a free eco-friendly fundraising scheme that helps schools and charities raise funds through textile recycling. Their aim is to promote the reuse of clothes and shoes to benefit those who rely on second hand clothes. For every 1kg we collect, they will pay us 50p. All money raised through this scheme will go straight back to the school for additional resources for all our children.

Wet items cannot be collected, so we will be keeping an eye on the weather when we decide the collection point!

Friends and family are welcome to join in too! Donated items can be collected in bin liners/available bags and we will let you know when and where to bring them in after Christmas!



As we come to the end of another busy term, I just wanted to update you on the work of the Slade Governing Body. We held our second Full Governing Body meeting of the year, where we discussed the school's development priorities for this year and started discussions about our strategic direction for the next few years. We have established a small sub-group of governors who will be considering what our priorities should be over the next 3-5 years and I look forward to sharing the results of their work in due course.

We also held the first meeting for this academic year of our Curriculum committee. These meetings focus on specific subjects and are an opportunity to hear from the subject leads and discuss their subjects in detail. This meeting focussed on Maths and English and gave us a good understanding of the progress in each of these subjects and the plans and targets for this academic year. We also discussed how the school is making use of the additional funding provided via the Pupil Premium and Sports Premium to ensure this money is being used effectively.



In addition to our meetings, governors also visited the school as part of our monitoring responsibilities. Visits this term covered Safeguarding and Health and Safety. We also continued our regular monitoring of the school's finances.



May I also take this opportunity to thank everyone who shared their thoughts via the governor's annual survey. I can assure you the comments received have all been shared with the school and will inform the decisions we make as we move forward.


