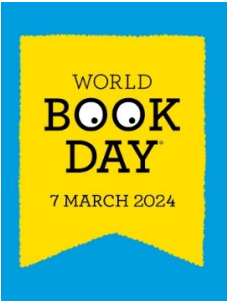

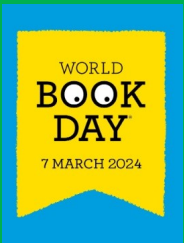

### Broken Connections

All of our parents, carers and friends will be aware that this has been a difficult and interesting first week back to school for Term 4 as we have suffered from connectivity problems which have taken away our internet and telephone systems.

This has meant that we have been unable to receive or send standard (non Arbor) emails or receive telephone calls into school since Tuesday afternoon.

This serious issue has affected schools and councils across areas in Kent and continues to be investigated and worked on at Kent County Council contractors Cantium and via Openreach, a company wholly owned by BT Group plc, that maintains the telephone cables, ducts, cabinets and exchanges that connect nearly all homes and businesses in the United Kingdom to the national broadband and telephone network.

Our sincere thanks to all of our families for your patience during this time and for adapting so quickly to messaging absences and sending urgent messages via SMS or the In App Messaging service via your Arbor App.

If you have sent us an email since 14:00 on Tuesday, we will not have received it. Please wait until we let you know that the system is all up and running again before attempting to resend anything that you still need us to see.

Our thanks also to the staff in the café at Tonbridge Swimming Pool, especially Liz, who has looked after us this week and kept your admin team equipped with internet and coffee!

‘Evelyn started off with a target of 10 books and she has ended up reading 25!

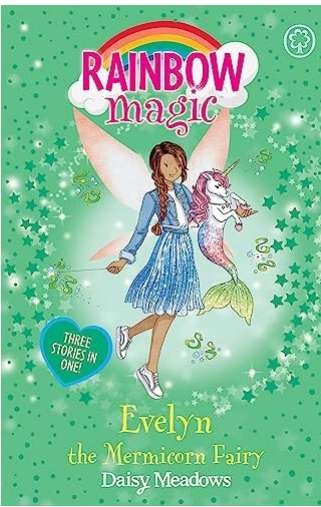

Additionally, if they would like to take part, children are invited to enter a competition to decorate a potato or top hat with a book theme.

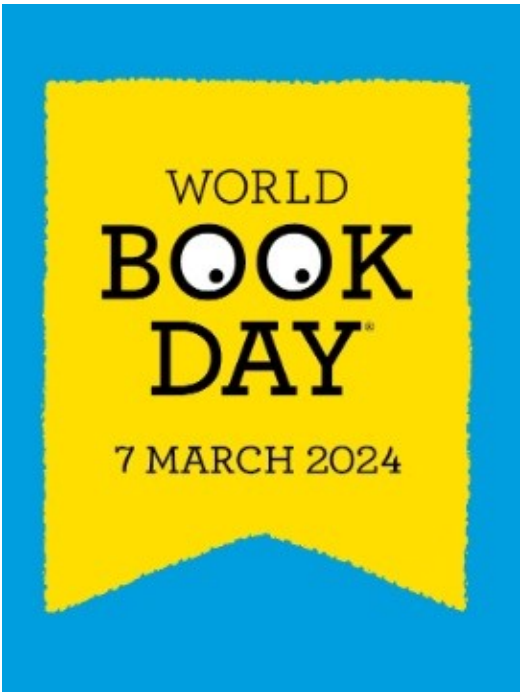

### Year 1 Visit Tunbridge Wells

The children in Pixie and Elf Classes in Year 1 travelled to Tunbridge Wells on Wednesday for a trip to visit The Amelia Scott Museum.

The visit was designed to enable the children to fully immerse themselves into their History topic this term which has been toys from across the years.

Through the day, the classes spent time on a tour of the fantastic facility and with guidance from the staff, searched high and low and around every corner for toys which have been popular with children their age, through the ages. They had reference guide which allowed them to know when each toy was popular.

Whilst one class was on a toy treasure hunt, the other was taking part in a special workshop designed for this topic. Not only did they get to see toys from different era's they actually got to handle them and see them in action!

This was a wonderful treat as they saw an old fashioned spinning top with a string pull, a cup and ball game and one that certainly does not get sold in shops now: a toy train that was powered by lighting a set of cotton buds which produced the steam from boiling water that made the toy train move along the track just like a real steam train!

Finally, they saw a game still enjoyed by millions across the globe, and which was once made in a factory here in West Kent, the table football game, Subbuteo.

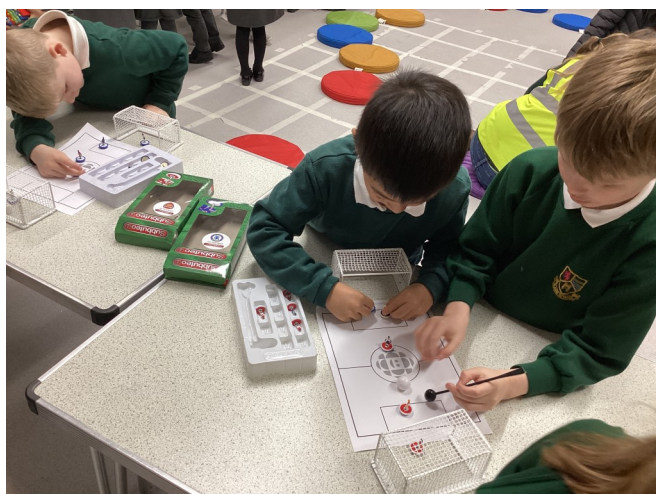
The children split into small groups to be able to have a go at the selection of toys and games demonstrated by the team at The Amelia Scott.

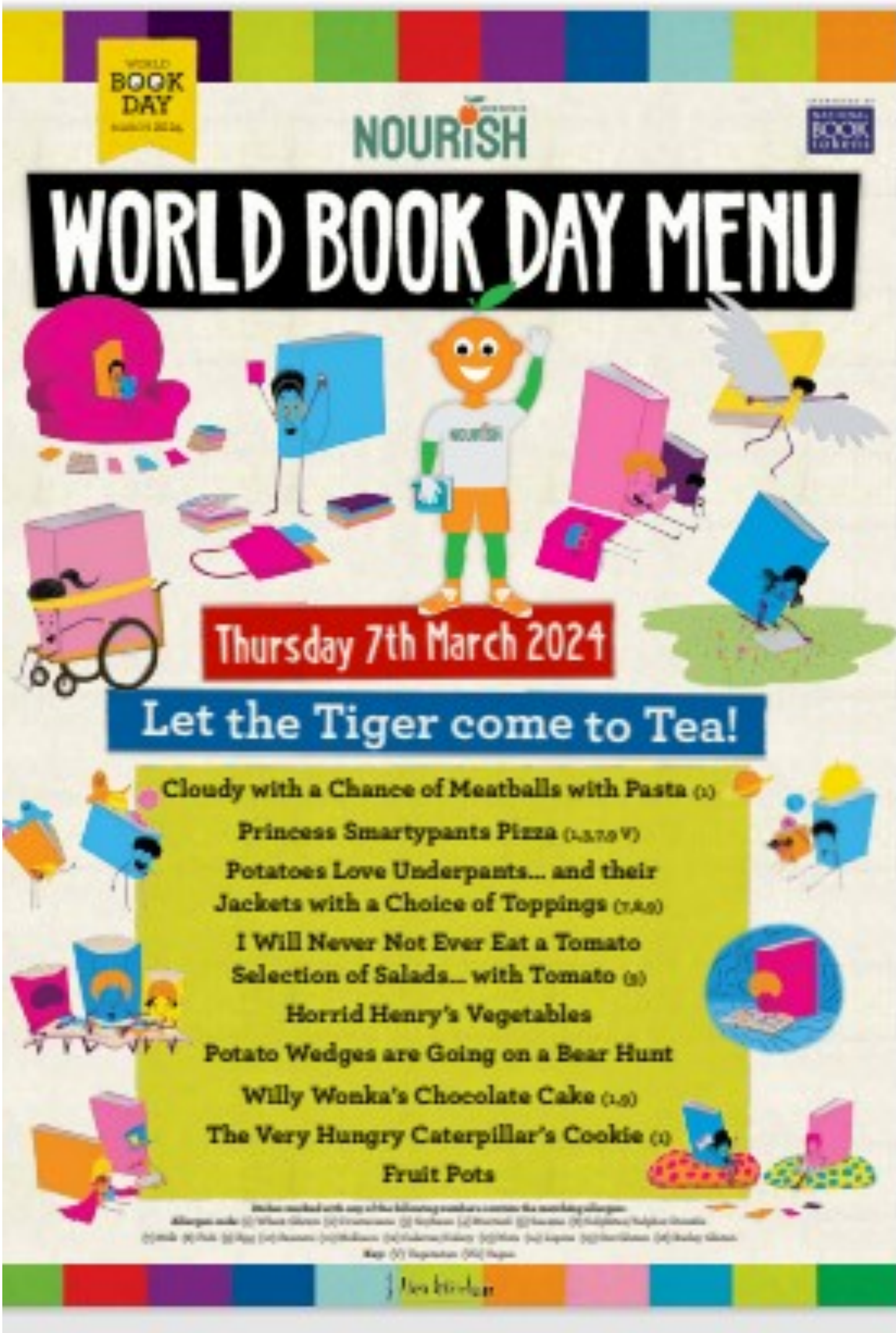

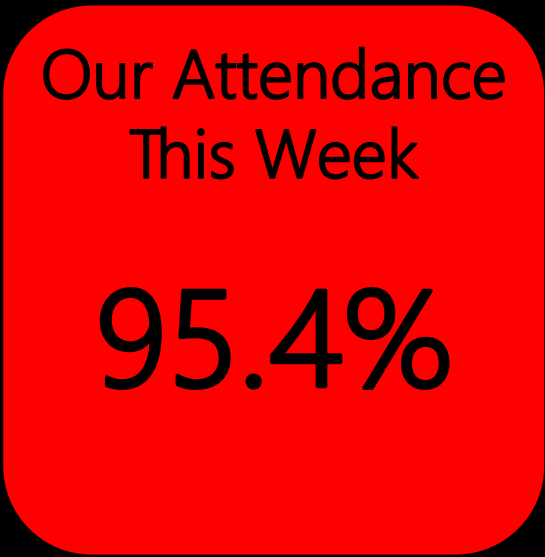

It is important that the children are at school on time every day to prevent disruption and upset to their day and for the rest of their class.

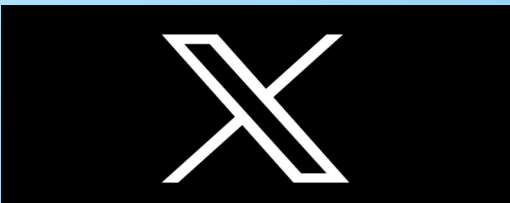
