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

School Applications -National offer Day

Secondary School Offer Day

This week, the email containing today's newsletter is not the most anticipated or exciting one dropping into inboxes for our Year 6 parents.

Today is National Offer Day for Secondary School places for children transferring to Key Stage 3 in September.

We hope that our families receive the news they want to see. If you have any questions about your offer you should contact your allocated school in the first instance. We will not be able to advise or assist at this stage.

Kent County Council provide this guidance for applicants who are unhappy with the offer made:

'We suggest that you view the school website to find out more about it.



If you are still unhappy you can put your child on the waiting list or <u>make an appeal</u> for any of the schools you applied for. You can do either or both for the same school or for different schools. For example, you can appeal for one school and put your child on the waiting list for another.

We recommend that you still accept the place your child has been offered. This will not affect your waiting list position or your appeal. It will guarantee your child has a school place if no places become available or if your appeal is unsuccessful. If the waiting list or appeal are successful you must remember to tell the school you were originally offered that you no longer want the place.'

As notified yesterday, the booking window to secure a meeting with your class teacher at our Spring Parent - Teacher Consultations will open at 20:00 on Monday 4 March.



School Attendance in Focus

Attendance remains high on our list of priorities as we encourage families to take family holidays and non urgent medical appointments out of school hours.

We ask for proof of attendance at a medical appointment, which is usually in the shape of a hospital or surgery letter. However, we know that this is not always possible when visiting the GP Surgery. Family Liaison Officer, Libby Wilmshurst, would like to share with parents a way that this proof could be obtained easily and for free, via the NHS App:

'As a parent, carer or other family member you can download the NHS App and you will be able to manage services for another person by switching to their profile. This is also sometimes called having a linked profile or having proxy access. It needs to be set up by a GP Surgery where you and the other person are both registered. GP and hospital appointments will be logged on here and by sharing a screenshot of the appointment time we will be able to log correctly on our registers, the reason for absence.

What is the NHS App?

The NHS App is owned and run by the NHS. It can be accessed by anyone aged 13 and over registered with an NHS GP surgery in England or Isle of Man.

Once you have verified your identity in the app, you will have easy, 24/7 access to a growing range of health services and information.

It doesn't replace existing services. You can still contact your GP surgery in the usual ways.

Can everyone use all of these services?

Not yet. The services you can access will vary depending on the ervices offered by your GP practice.

EYFS & KS1 Film Night Wednesday 13 March






Lunchtimes in the Library


