




Primary School Admissions 2024/25

This week has seen an exciting and nervous wait for parents across the country of children born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020 as they waited for local authorities to inform them of the primary school their child had been allocated in preparation for starting school in September.

We would like to thank everyone of the 205 families who listed Slade as one of their three choices for choosing us and wish everyone who did not receive a place here well.

Of the 60 children who have been offered a place at Slade, we have already received nearly 40 acceptances and we are very grateful to those parents who have replied speedily to the initial offer and to filling out our admissions form - this makes the process this summer much quicker to administer, so many thanks to you all!

We would like to say a big hello to all of our new parents and families, especially those dipping in to read the newsletter for the first time today, and to those who have joined the Slade X Feed as well - great to have you with us!

Over the Easter holiday we were delighted to hear about the success experienced by Lily in Hydra Class as she became the second pupil at Slade to take part in a competition run by the National Schools Equestrian Association, following in the footsteps of fellow rider, Francesca, who we featured on these pages earlier in the year.

Lily was taking part in both the 40cm and 50cm jumps competition at the Schools Showjumping Trials earlier this month.

It was a magical day for Lily and her new horse, Rita. They came fourth in the 50cm competition and were the overall winners in first place in the 40cm jumps. This means that Lily has now qualified for the schools finals day at the famous venue of Hickstead later in the summer.

Lily has only just started riding with Rita, a young grey, as she was previously partnered with a younger horse named Doris. Lily explained why she has improved so much as a rider since linking up with Rita, 'Doris was less experienced, and she could not help me as a young rider myself. She did not make it easy for anyone to ride her and she was a lot of hard work. Fortunately, we found Rita who was a lot more experienced and the connection was immediate - we help each other, which makes the ride safer for both of us and more fun.'

Not that the first trip she did with Rita was easy, 'We actually got Rita from Yorkshire.' explains Lily, 'the journey back was very slow and of course you worry if she was going to be okay in the back. But it all worked out and I am pleased that she is so happy in her new home.'

Many congratulations to Lily and Rita for their recent success and we wish them well for their future competitions as they continue to bond as friends, especially in the upcoming finals at Hickstead.


