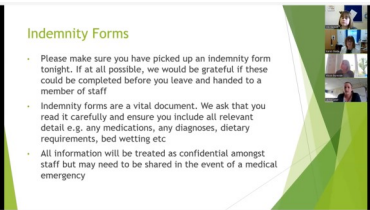
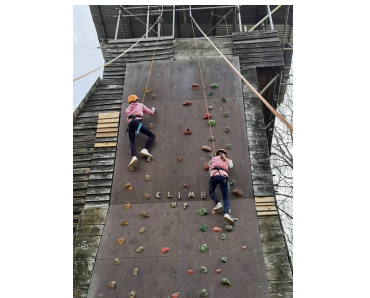

### Slade Primary School Ofsted Report 2024

On Tuesday, you will have received the full written report that followed the inspection at Slade by schools regulator, Ofsted.

This report will shortly be available for wider reading on the Ofsted website, as well as on our own. The inspection, which took place on 5 and 6 March concluded that Slade is a Good provider in all areas and was described by Mrs Slade as, 'a great achievement and true reflection of the positive journey of improvement that the school has been on in recent years.'

Mrs Slade was also keen to thank our parent and carer community: 'Once again, many thanks to all the parents and carers who took the time to answer the Ofsted parental survey. The inspectors were not only hugely impressed by the volume of responses that they received but also with the level of positivity within the feedback that they read too.'



### Castle Parking Plans Protested

The sound of children playing, having fun in the sun filled the air over the last week as parents, carers, friends and neighbours gathered together against the plans of Tonbridge and Malling Council to extend the parking area at Castle Fields carpark, taking away the play area currently enjoyed by children at Slade and other local residents and visitors to the area.

The plans continue to be contested and following the Overview and Scrutiny meeting earlier this week, the question has now been deferred back to the Council for final consideration at their meeting on Tuesday 30 April.

### Allergy Awareness Week

This week we have held our very first Allergy Awareness Week, which has meant every child at Slade taking part in special, age related activities and learning as they have found out what an allergy is, the different types of allergy as well as how to prevent someone from having an allergic reaction and knowing what to do if they someone having an allergic reaction.

#### What does it mean to have an allergy?

- \* An **allergy** is where your body reacts to something that is normally harmless
- \* If you have an allergic reaction then your body thinks it will be harmful to it

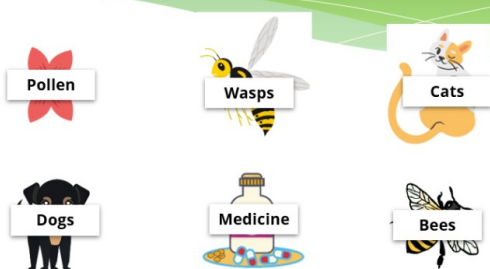


Please speak to your children about this subject and the learning they have taken part in this week.

Remember, you can update your child's Arbor account at anytime to reflect an allergy that you suspect or have been diagnosed with since starting school.

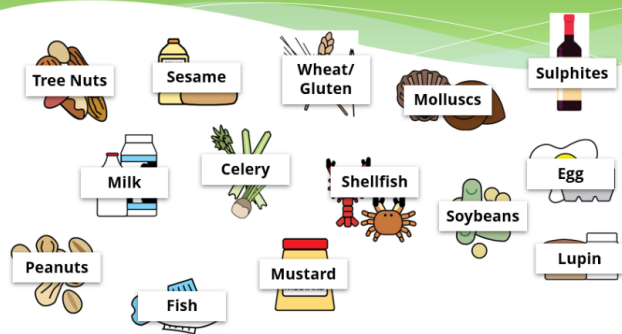

#### Other common allergens



#### Top 14 food allergens

Many other foods can also cause allergic reactions. Some people can react to even tiny amounts of the food!



#### What is anaphylaxis?

Anaphylaxis (pronounced ana-fil-ax-is) is the most **serious** type of allergic reaction.

It can be need emergency treatment with a medicine called '**adrenaline**'.

#### What are the signs of anaphylaxis?

**Serious reaction (anaphylaxis) signs include:**

- **A**irway - Hard to swallow/coughing
- **B**reathing - Difficult to breathe/noisy breathing
- **C**irculation - Feeling dizzy, floppy or sleepy

#### Other allergic reaction signs

**Other signs can include:**

- Itchy skin rash
- Itchy/tingling mouth
- Puffy lips, face or eyes
- Tummy pain or being sick

The signs above can also happen on their own. If there are no ABC signs, the allergic reaction is likely to be less serious and not anaphylaxis.

#### Remember ABC!

#### Medication

- When someone has a serious allergic reaction (anaphylaxis), they have to use a medicine pen which looks like this.
- It injects a medicine called '**adrenaline**' into the top of the person's leg to make them feel better.
- These are also called adrenaline auto-injectors. There are 3 brand types in the UK (EpiPen, Emerade and Jext).



#### What does it feel like to have an allergy?

- Being allergic to something can feel very scary.
- Someone with an allergy has to be careful about what they do and make sure they stay away from the thing/things that make them feel ill.
- This can make them feel different or left out.

#### What you can do to help

**If your friend has an allergy, you can:**

- Wash your hands to keep them clean when with your friend.
- Help your friend to stay away from the things which make them ill.
- Ask your friend about their allergy and how it makes them feel.
- Don't share your lunch or snacks.
- Know what happens to someone when they have an allergic reaction and get help quickly if you see one happening.

Allergies of children and staff at Slade are the reason why we ask for no nuts in any snack or lunch brought to school, or packets of sweets handed out amongst all of the children in a class (for example, when it is a birthday.)

### Enjoying Poetry, Gaining Confidence

Phoenix Class is a very cultured place to be first thing every morning, and we are grateful to Mr Osborne and to Oscar in particular for sharing the story of how a little learning is going a long way in Year 4.

Every week, the children choose a poem to learn before either reciting, or reading it out to the rest of their class. Mr Osborne gives them the choice of using a poem from a book, or for them to write and read their own.

The exercise has multiple benefits as it exposes the class to the many different styles of poetry, it allows the creative juices to flow by writing some of their own poems, and also in how they articulate them when reading. Most of all, it has improved the confidence of the children and allowed them to become public speakers, without even realising it!

The other added gain has been how the rest of the class respond to the performances - they listen with interest and respect and have shown how to be a polite and responsive audience.

Oscar has his own positive experience since the beginning of the year, that he was pleased to share:

‘I am usually a shy person, but I now find it fun to speak in front of the class. I would never had managed to speak up as I can now without doing it so regularly with the poems. I like funny poems, but also poems that are different. The most recent poem I read was one I wrote myself, called The Life of a Goldfish. I thought of the words when I was in the shower! It is based on my auntie’s old goldfish.’

Oscar likes to write his own, and has kept them all together in a pack. He likes to look back on the poems he has written and read, and one of his favourites is called Presents.

‘Presents is based on my cats Orieo and Bella. They like to think they are bringing us presents, but it is not actually very good, because the presents are usually mice!’

We agreed that the poems were especially good because they tell an often serious story in very few, well crafted words, but also make you laugh and smile.

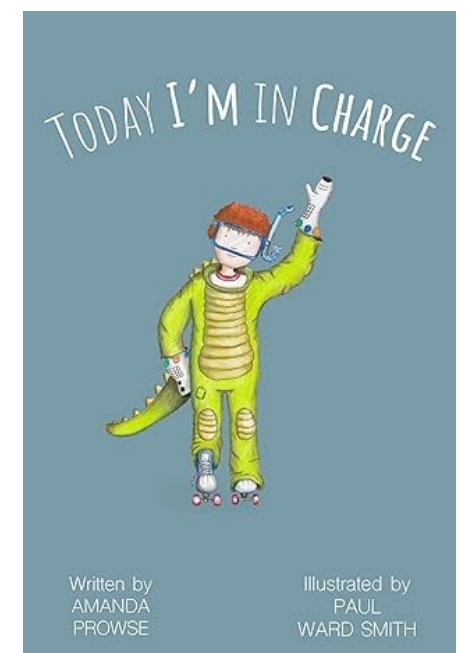
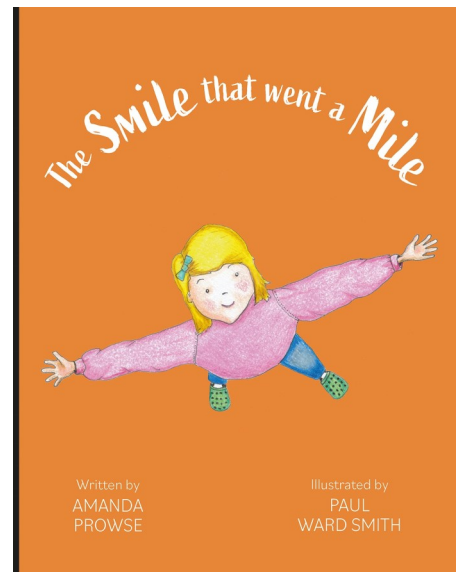
Local man Paul and author Amanda are tireless in their support for libraries across the country - especially at this time when so many of them are under threat of closure and were in Tonbridge with copies of their children's book *The Smile that went a Mile*.

Katie from Gnome Class takes up the story of the morning, 'We had a great visit to the library because the author Amanda and illustrator Paul were there. Paul read the book *The Smile that went a Mile* to us all. He was fantastic because he read all of the characters in different voices which made the story easy to understand and even more fun. Some of the voices were really high, some really low!

I loved the story because it was all about a smile. The girl in the book is called Emily and she likes to smile and she really wants everyone else in the town to smile too. It is her smile that travels a mile!

In addition to *The Smile that went a Mile*, Paul read another of his and Amanda's books, *Today I'm in Charge*. Katie continued, 'Paul explained what this book was all about and he also showed us his illustrations. He told us how he comes to think about what his pictures should look like. He likes to listen to the book and imagine - then he can draw the people and the action just as he sees it. He is a very good drawer!'

We are incredibly grateful to Amanda and Paul for their time and generosity. They were happy to give each child a copy of *The Smile that went a Mile* and even signed copies of the book as well.

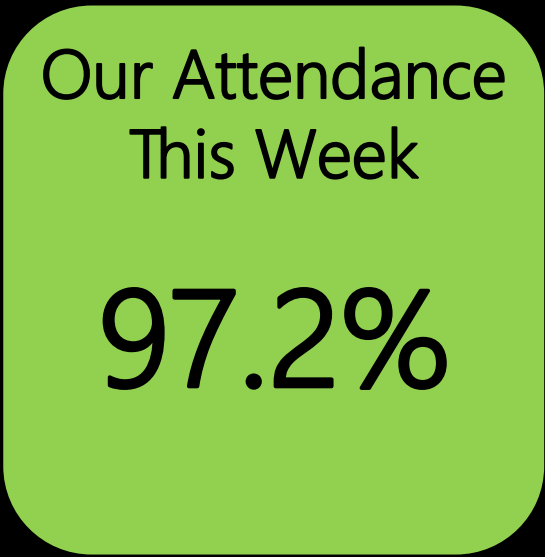

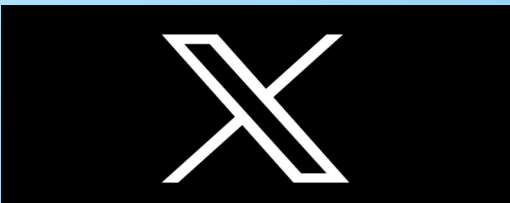
