FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents and Carers,

There was much excitement amongst the children today as they returned to the school field at lunchtime to enjoy our vast outdoor space and all that it offers. It was heartening to see all year groups enjoying their time outdoors in the early summer sunshine; this was the first time that the children were able to take their lunchtime break down on the field since October! The field has also been getting busier both before and after school too with some of the outdoor clubs and activities that happen across the week starting to once again take place out there. Speaking of which, good luck to our Year 5 footballers who take on Sussex Road in a local derby out there on the field after school today. This week has been Deaf Awareness week, which is an annual event to raise awareness of the challenges of deafness and hearing loss whilst also promoting the positive aspects of deafness. On Tuesday, all the children across the school attended an assembly led by the Titans Team staff which reminded us of things to remember when communicating with anyone with a hearing impairment and what we can do in school to support our deaf community. Well done to four of our Year 6 pupils who represented the school yesterday at a local primary school debate, organised by the Councillor James Lark, Mayor of Tonbridge and Malling, and held in the Council Chambers at Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council. The children enjoyed a tour of the chamber, learning about how to debate effectively and vote responsibly, before they then put everything that they had learnt to the test during a debate of their own, debating whether children should be concerned about the level of sugar in food and drinks. KS2 Statutory Assessment Tests

The annual run of statutory assessments has come around again, and next week they kick off with the KS2 SATs for our Year 6 children.

The pupils in Dragon and Griffin classes are well prepared for the tests and know that they are a chance to show off everything they have been learning as well as being the gateway to a term of fun as soon as they are over which includes the Residential Week of Activities amongst lots of other planned events.

In order to set them up as well as you can for the assessments please make sure that they arrive on time (between 08:40 and 08:50) having had a good breakfast. We will make sure this is the case for any of the children at Yeti’s Breakfast Club. The tests are regulated and are due to start as soon as the school day starts, so latecomers will affect the routine and confidence of not just themselves, but of classmates too.

Equipment will be provided, but please bring in a full water bottle each day.

Monday 13 May: English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (Paper 1 Questions, Paper 2 Spellings)

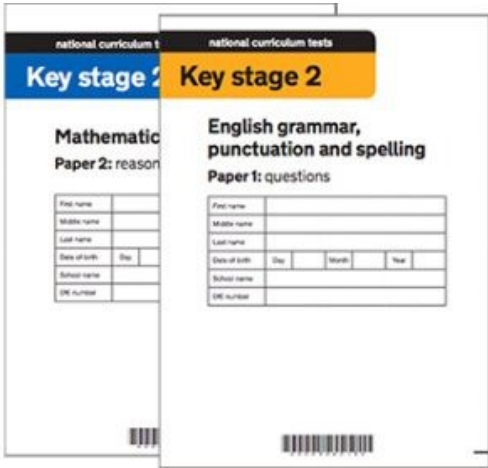
Tuesday 14 May: English Reading

Yeti's Booking Window For Term 6

The booking window for securing spaces in Yeti's opens on Wednesday 15 May at 10:00.

For the first time, sessions will be booked using your Arbor account as we move towards having all of our services under one application.

The reason we will be opening the booking sessions during the day on this occasion is so we can handle any questions or problems that may occur.

To book sessions on Arbor for Wraparound care you must first log in to your Arbor account and make sure that there are funds in the Wraparound Care section . You do this by going to:

- Accounts - Wraparound Care - Top Up Account (Green Button)

Sessions will not be able to be booked without funds being in the account.

Parents should be aware of the following:

Staying at After School Club from the end of school to after 16:30

You will need to book places at both Session 1 (15:30 -16:30) and Session 2 (16:30 - 17:30)

After Activity

If you are booking a session at After School Club for a period that follows a sports or leisure activity, you should choose Session 2. Please note, this session is now bookable by parents directly and not by the School Office

Late Collections

If you are late collecting children from school at the collection time, we reserve the right to charge for the appropriate Wraparound Care session. For example late collection from the gate may incur a charge for a stay at After School Club Session 1. Collecting late from a Session 1 booking may incur a charge for a stay at After School Club Session 2.

Ruby Shines at Gymnastics Competition

Ruby in Sphinx Class has proved to be a superstar on the gym floor once again.

Building on her success in last year’s equivalent Kent Gymnastics competition, Ruby again took well deserved prizes away for her and her team; Weald Gymnastics Club.

She was very proud as she told us about the event, which took place last weekend, ‘We had to perform in front of two judges for each of the sections we were competing in and to gain points we needed to make sure we were very good. I took part in the vault, where I came first. For the vault I had to jump up on the apparatus using the springboard, do a move such as a handstand and jump off the other end with grace as you finish with a ‘présent’. I received a score of 11.5 /12 for my vault, which was excellent.’

Ruby was not just excelling at the vault, she also took part in the Floor competition where she finished second.

‘I was actually moved up to the intermediate competition for my Floor, because the organisers knew that my routine was much harder and they wanted to make sure that I was rewarded for that. I included handstands and walkovers and finished second with a score of 11.4/12 which I was so pleased with.’



Pure Football Lift The Trophy

Congratulations, also to William in Pegasus Class who enjoyed success with his football team on Bank Holiday Monday. William is the central defender for his side, Pure Football Academy, who ran out champions in the local DNA Elite Sports Under 8 Cup held at Longmead Stadium, home of Tonbridge Angels.

It was not an easy tournament to win either! William takes up the story, ‘ we had to play four group matches, then the quarter finals, the semi finals before the final itself against Elite Academy which we won 1:0 to lift the trophy. The trophy was competed by teams from across the area and it was great to win!’

William puts a lot of praise towards the coach of the team, Noah, ‘He has made me a better footballer and gives us confidence. I have been playing at Pure for three years and I enjoy it lots. We have players from all different schools in Tonbridge.’

Well done to all of the team and to William for commanding performances at the back for his side.

2024 Mayoral Debate

On Thursday, Mrs Potter was very happy to be joined by the Year 6 members of our Pupil Council as they travelled to the Kings Hill Chambers of Tonbridge and Malling Council.

They had been invited, along with their contemporaries from other schools in the borough to the annual Mayoral debate, where the incumbent local mayor of Tonbridge and Malling introduced topics that the children were to debate.

First, they received training on how to conduct and take part in an effective debate with colleagues and adversaries such as those that happen in local councils up and down the country on a weekly basis and they had a tour of the venue where all of the important local decisions are made.

The Mayor, Cllr James Lark then introduced the topics up for discussion, and in which our members Leo, Sophie, George and Rittaj took part:

- Should mobile telephones be allowed in primary and secondary schools?
- Should we be concerned about the amount of sugar in foods and drinks?
- Should schools ban sweets?
- Are school meals healthy and nutritious and are they good value for money?

That last one prompted plenty of 'healthy' feedback as part of the debate and subsequent vote!

Why don't you continue these discussions at home? It will be interesting to see what your children feel about these topics!



The collated council of 20 children from the invited primary schools attending the Mayoral Debate yesterday voted as follows on the motions put to them:

Should we be concerned about the amount of sugar in certain foods and drinks - Unanimous vote for **YES 20:0**

Should schools ban birthday sweets - YES 8: **12 NO**

Are school meals healthy, nutritious and good value for money - **YES 10:10 NO**

Should mobile telephones be allowed in primary and secondary schools - **YES 12:8 NO**

Pirate Menu: Thursday 16 May

As part of the last National School Census of this academic year, the Government survey each school in the land to find out how many school dinners have been eaten. Part of this is for the statistics you will see quoted in the national news, but it also feeds into central budgets, particularly into the amount of money the Treasury feels it right to provide for Free School Meals, Pupil Premium funding and the provision for the universally free meals enjoyed by pupils in EYFS and KS1 yeargroups.

Therefore, we encourage as many children as possible to choose a school meal on census day, which is next Thursday. Nourish have put together a fun menu and competition to celebrate the day.

The menu is pirate themed, below and Kirsty, our resident Nourish Chef, would love to see many pirate hats submitted for her special competition, with prizes to be handed out in a future Celebration Assembly.

Remember, meals are completely free to any child in receipt of benefits related Free School Meals, to those eligible for Pupil Premium funding and to all children in EYFS and Key Stage 1. To all other pupils, the cost is £2.45 per meal and should be paid for, in advance, via the Meals section of your Arbor account.
