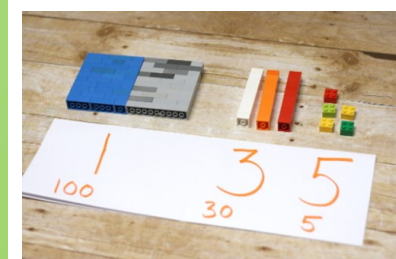

Evelyn attends the Weald Gymnastics Club and took part in her first ever competition at the club.

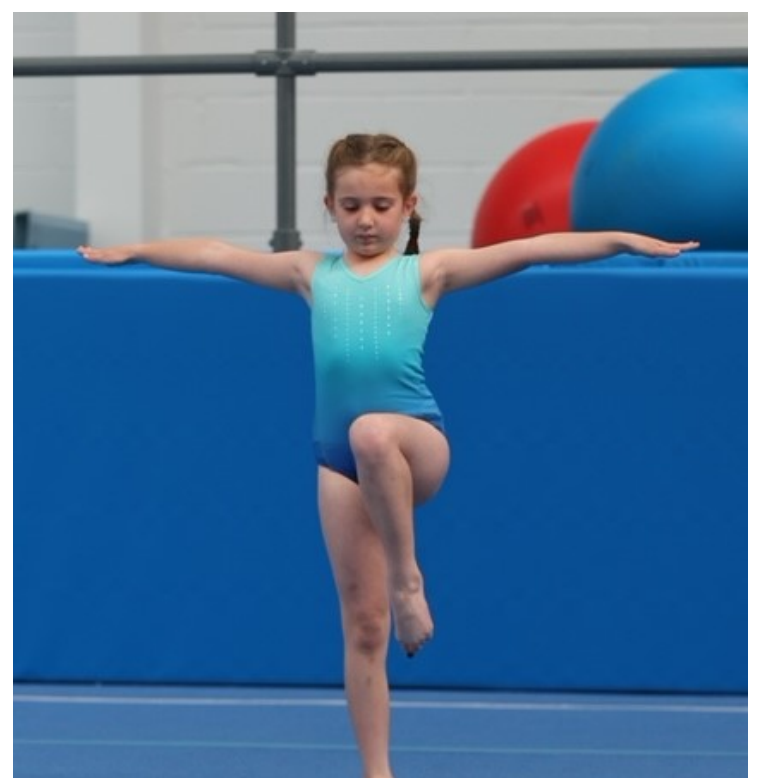
Evelyn felt overjoyed at taking part and very proud of her achievement, but woke up with a mixture of emotions, as she told us earlier this week:

### Double Football Champions

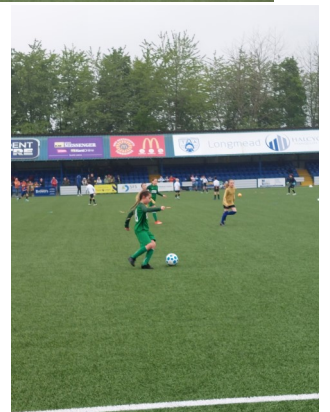
We saw the bringing home of two trophies in two days for our girls football teams this week.

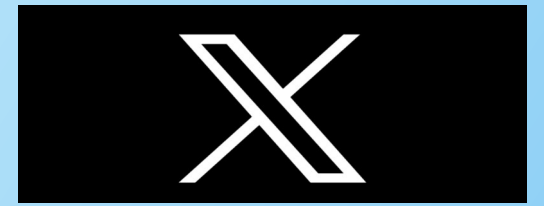
